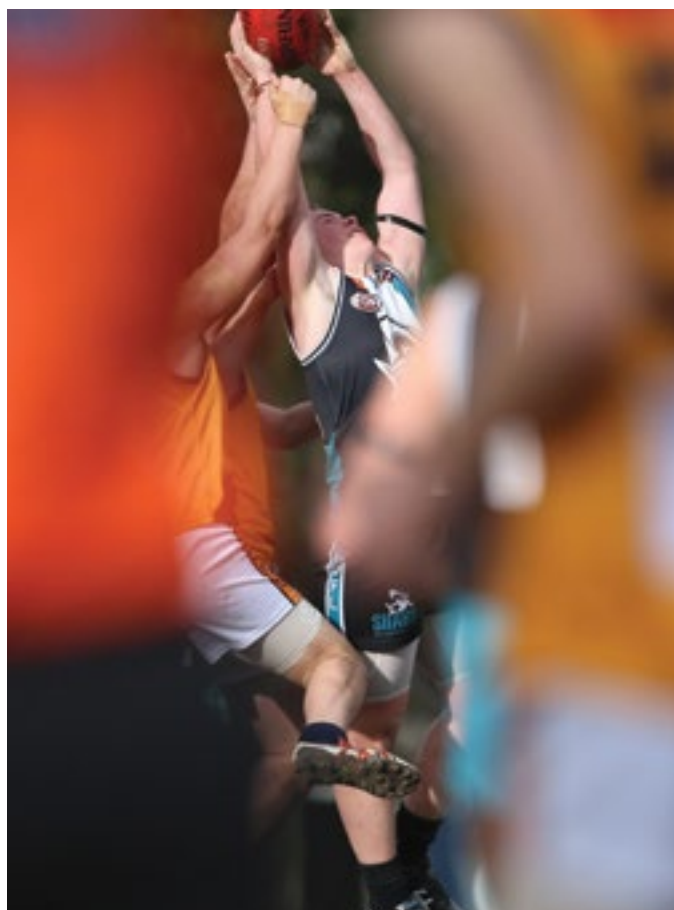

Chairman

THE Essendon District Football League achieved outstanding results both on-field and off-field in 2016.

FOOTBALL

The three senior divisions again proved what an inspirational decision it was to expand to three divisions. All three senior premiers – Keilor, Craigieburn and East Keilor – should be very proud of their achievements in a quality suburban competition. Never before have we seen such evenness across all three divisions. The EDFL's junior competition continues to grow in clubs and teams, to the extent that in 2016 we had 249 teams participate, which is an EDFL record. The EDFL Umpires Association also reached record levels, with 524 registered umpires. The Senior Thirds competition is continuing to grow and will become an integral part of our clubs' futures as we look to maintain participation, especially from juniors to seniors. Admittedly, the EDFL Board was apprehensive when this competition was established. There was a belief that there may have been an unhealthy focus on mature footballers. However, it is pleasing to see clubs focusing on juniors in establishing an extra team.

SENIOR INTERLEAGUE

The EDFL again participated in the AFL Victoria WorkSafe Community Championships. In 2016 each football league in Victoria was given a ranking and played off against the next ranked league. The EDFL was initially ranked as the fifth league in Victoria, which pitted us against the Goulburn Valley Football League, who was ranked sixth. The EDFL was again led by Mick McGuane (Keilor) and Jeff Geischen, with support from Dean Wallis (Essendon Doutta Stars), Adam Potter (Aberfeldie) and Shannon Grant (Greenvale). The game was played at Windy Hill, where an undersized EDFL side led for most of the day to defeat the Goulburn Valley by four points in a thriller. The performance of the coaching panel and players was outstanding, as we were able to manufacture a win whilst resisting an onslaught from the Goulburn Valley in the last quarter.

To all that supported the Interleague Program, thank you. The AFL Victoria WorkSafe Community Championships are an integral part of football in Victoria and the EDFL is proud to be involved. In 2017 the EDFL will likely play the Eastern Football League, and we need more support and commitment.

EDFL LIFE MEMBERSHIP

EDFL Life Membership can always be a contentious issue. That, however, does not apply with the league's 2016 inductee, Bruce Kent. We are all well-aware of Bruce's involvement with Greenvale Football & Cricket Club and what they are developing

at Section Road. However, it is Bruce's time, effort, guidance and support as a confidant to the greater EDFL that the majority does not see, nor understand. The EDFL is truly thankful for Bruce Kent's involvement and he is a worthy Life Member.

EDFL BOARD

In these changing and challenging times, the EDFL clubs can be thankful that they have a proud, passionate and hardworking board representing them. The EDFL is not unlike clubs, in that stability with management is a forerunner to sustained strength. To each of the Board Members; Arthur Crofts, Romy Gutbier, Bernie Shinnars, Wayne Anthony, Tanya Taylor and Rob Castellias, I thank you for your support and commitment in our desire to keep the EDFL at the forefront of community football.

THE FUTURE

The relocation of the off-field operations to Windy Hill has been seamless and the benefits will be limitless. We also undertook a review and restructure of our staff and those changes are continuing to evolve.

Community football in Victoria is facing an uncertain future. The Player Points System was introduced in 2016 and a salary cap will commence from 2017. The EDFL is fully supportive of both measures to have a positive impact on club sustainability. However, we are against change based on assumption or no factual evidence. We believe that any change of this magnitude should be gradual and well-thought out, with a documented plan of three to five years.

The opportunities that the EDFL has with being based at Windy Hill are endless. We will have a scoreboard installed prior to the 2017 Finals Series. This scoreboard will present another form of revenue through naming rights and advertising. In the long-term we need to upgrade the lighting so that the umpires can better prepare and to give us greater flexibility with fixturing. We need to maximize the opportunities in regards to advertising and catering and



better control associated revenue streams. Due to the EDFL constitutional changes, we are better prepared to consider any opportunity that presents itself. It is important that we all have a view of the EDFL in 2017, 2018 and beyond. However, it is more important that we have a view of the greater EDFL in 2027, 2037 and beyond.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

To all the club presidents that are moving on, I thank you for your involvement in the EDFL and the many long, unrewarded hours that you devoted to your club. I hope that your stepping down is part of a succession plan and that you will remain visible with the EDFL. To the majority that are continuing in the role of president, I also thank you. Whilst it can be unforgiving and lonely at times, it is also rewarding and satisfying. The progress that our clubs are making on and off the field has been significant over the past 10 years and you should all be proud of your achievements. The EDFL is a strong and vibrant competition that has reached a level of evenness not seen in its history. As I said, community football is changing. However, we must maintain the strength and relevance of the EDFL.

Chief Executive Officer

THE Essendon District Football League continues to maintain its position as a premier community competition within the Australian Football landscape. The league has maintained its strong financial position, the on-field product continues to be the envy within community football circles, and several key indicators continue to rise, positioning the EDFL in a position of strength for the future.

MANAGEMENT REVIEW

The first point of business for the year was to undertake a review of the EDFL's management structure and operations. The previous structure had served the EDFL well and was integral in establishing the EDFL's current governance and financial strength. However, the continued growth of football combined with the addition of AFL Victoria's Football Development Managers necessitated a change in the structure to ensure that the EDFL continued to service clubs, participants and the game in an efficient and effective manner. This review led to the recruitment of Stuart Balloch in a dedicated Football Operations Manager role as well as the alteration of existing positions. Having a dedicated two-person Football Operations Department has already reaped positive developments with respect to the growth of Girls Football, strengthening the relationship with the junior departments within clubs and providing greater support to trainers.

WINDY HILL

The protracted negotiations with Essendon Football Club finally concluded and 2016 saw the EDFL relocate our administration base to Windy Hill. A five-year agreement with two five-year options ensures the EDFL's long-term presence at the venue. Relocation ensures that the EDFL's administration is housed in a professional environment; it strengthens the EDFL's football presence at the venue for umpire training, Interleague games and finals matches; it allows umpire courses, training and education to be conducted on-site with suitable facilities; and it provides a venue that has sufficient space to accommodate growth. The ability to retain Marshall Road importantly provides the EDFL with an additional income stream, allowing the EDFL to increase its revenue-raising ability without the need to place additional burden on clubs.

AFL VICTORIA

The EDFL continues to maintain a strong relationship with AFL Victoria. The two Football Development Managers in Mark Morgan and Gavin Mahony continue to be housed at the EDFL's offices, which provides a direct relationship between the EDFL's operations and programs and those conducted by AFL

Victoria.

Having myself as a member of the Community Club Sustainability Program ensures that the EDFL Board are continually updated on discussions and changes in the Player Points System and Player Salary Cap. This is important with these two programs being the biggest change to community football in the history of the game. As an affiliate of AFL Victoria I would like to acknowledge the support and assistance AFL Victoria, in particular Chief Executive Officer Steven Reaper, Community Football and Engagement Manager Brett Connell and Metropolitan Football Manager Michael Daniher.

FINANCIAL

It is pleasing to report that the EDFL has maintained our strong financial position despite incurring significant costs in the relocation from Marshall Road to Windy Hill. These costs were offset by a 13 per cent increase in sponsorship, topping \$170,000 for the first time in the EDFL's history. This highlights a significant increase in sponsorship revenue in recent years, with sponsorship less than \$50,000 as recently as 2010. The ability to generate significant revenue through the rental of Marshall Road and through grants has also had a major impact on revenue levels. This has led to annual turnover increasing to \$2.17 million. The overall loss of \$7000 for the financial year is justified by the one-off relocation expenses involved in moving to Windy Hill. It has become a popular trend to impose a registration levy on participants, with most metropolitan leagues now having a player levy of varying amounts. The EDFL is one of the few to resist this trend and the ability to generate non-football related revenue combined with continued prudent financial management will be important to ensure the EDFL continues to avoid the introduction of such a levy.

EDFL PARTNERS

I must extend my appreciation to the Strathmore Community Bank, who is a wonderful partner of the EDFL and a number of our football clubs. The Strathmore Community Bank is the naming rights sponsor of the senior Premier Division and Division 2 competitions. The continued support of the Strathmore Community Bank is evidenced by the new five-year corporate partnership agreement signed at the start of the 2016 season. The support from Chairman Peter McKie, Secretary Peter Brown and all the directors and bank staff has been tremendous and has allowed the EDFL to introduce several new initiatives without the need to increase the financial burden on our clubs. I must also acknowledge the support from Essendon Ford as the naming rights sponsor of the Division 1 competition,



Apprenticeships Plus as the naming rights sponsor of the EDFL's Under 18.5 competitions and Just Cuts as the major sponsor of the EDFL's juniors. A suite of other sponsors includes Ageless Herbals, Ascot Vale Sports and Trophies, Club Warehouse, Coburg Physiotherapy, Elastoplast, Essendon Football Club, Glenroy Bakery, Grashan Sportswear, Hot Sub, Hypoxi Moonee Ponds, Just Cuts, Lionheart Security, M&A Wilson Signs, The Valley, Pascoe Vale Hotel, P.W. Glass, Red Onion Creative, SEDA, Sherrin and Sportsmoves, to whom the EDFL is extremely appreciative of their support.

APPRECIATION

I extend my appreciation to the EDFL Board of Management for their support and guidance and to the EDFL staff of Greta May (Corporate Services Manager), Stuart Balloch (Football Operations Manager), Adem Saricaoglu (Media Manager), Rowan Sawers (Director of Umpiring) and Ken Waters (Umpires Administration Officer). I must make special mention of the hard work and support of Steph Zerowsky, Michael Russell and Chris Johnson, all of whom left a positive impact on the league. Steph commenced her role with the EDFL in 2011 in the Football Operations Department and will leave the organisation to take up a position with the Western Region Football League. Michael was employed directly by the EDFL as Community Relations Officer and focussed on providing direct support to EDFL clubs, whilst Steph was employed by AFL Victoria as Football Development Manager supporting grass roots football in Moonee Valley, Brimbank and Melton. Finally, thank you to all volunteers involved in all EDFL clubs and congratulations on a magnificent 2016 season. It is the dedication and commitment of club volunteers that is the lifeblood of community football and it is a credit to everyone at clubland for the health and vibrancy of the EDFL.

Football Operations

SUNDAY FOOTBALL - YOUTH

Weekly our Sunday Junior Program offers opportunities to over 200 teams and over 4000 participants ranging from Under 8s through to Under 16s. To all the finalists and premiership teams, congratulations on your efforts. To Rob Stafrace, Rick Caffari, Jarrad Carey, Charlie Maglogiannis, Troy Newton, Darryl Maher and Rick Byers, thank you for all for your hard work and dedication to the 2016 Youth Interleague Program. I would also like to acknowledge the clubs that hosted our programmed Interleague matches, to Burnside Heights, Craigieburn the Calder Cannons (RAMS Arena), Keilor Park, Jacana and Avondale Heights, you did us proud. We have a healthy talented player pathway offering opportunities for youth development through the Calder Cannons and the Western Jets TAC Cup programs. Thanks to Ian Kyte (Calder Cannons) and Shane Sexton (Western Jets) for the hard work they provided to the respective programs and the support from their coaches and staff.

This was the final year of even-age groups for the EDFL as we move to the odd-age structure. I have been able to have some healthy discussion with the Junior Co-Ordinator Group and I thank you all for your attendance at the junior forums that have been held in 2016. I look forward to continual improvement in 2017. Lastly to Romy Gutbier, thanks for your support and assistance co-ordinating the Junior Advisory Group and leading the charge with the Junior Program, most notably junior grading. This is a thankless task that aims to encourage healthier junior competition and to date, this has been achieved.

JUNIOR GIRLS PROGRAM

There is much excitement surrounding the Junior Girls Program, as early indications show growth in the club participants base on the eve of the inaugural season of AFL Women's. The EDFL is set to run its own Junior Girls Competition in conjunction with its Junior Program in 2017 following the 2016 Western Youth Girls Competition, which comprised of both EDFL and WRFL teams. To David Newton and Tim Shelcott at the WRFL, thanks for the support and

thanks also to Ron Sikora and his team for your efforts in the WYG Interleague Program.

SATURDAY FOOTBALL - UNDER 18.5 & OPEN AGE

Congratulations to all clubs who participated in the 2016 EDFL Finals Series. These matches were all played in great spirits and showcased the amazing brand of football that the EDFL has to offer. To those crowned premiers, it is no doubt an acknowledgement of the efforts from your entire club and a lot of hard work and dedication. Thanks to Coburg Lions and West Coburg (Coburg City Oval), Keilor, Greenvale, Glenroy, Craigieburn and the Calder Cannons (RAMS Arena), and Hadfield for hosting both junior and senior finals across very busy weekends. Thanks also must go to Sue and Phil Aston, represented by Fiona at our main venues, for conducting the ticketing and access to all our finals and the Interleague games for 2016. It is an unappreciated task dealing with numerous consumer-based issues. To Jeff Gieschen, your guidance and support of our 2016 Senior Interleague Program was testament to the two victories that we had over the Goulbourn Valley Football League in the Under 18s and Seniors. To Mick McGuane, supported by Shannon Grant, Dean Wallis and Adam Potter and the cast of Keilor volunteers, trainers and staff, your efforts were truly appreciated and we hope that we can build on the success of 2016. Thanks also to Geoff Maddern and his support staff from the Under 18s.

This year marked the inception of the Player Points Program and will be the last year of club operation outside of an imposed salary cap, to be adopted for the 2017 season. The direction and implementation of these programs fall under a Club Sustainability Model that is being rolled out across Victoria. These initiatives aim to place less strain on our clubs' resources and will hopefully provide measure to equalise the competition. Thanks to Ken Waters, who handed over the reins of the player points allocation and for your work in allocating and assessing the entire league's player points prior to me jumping on board.

UMPIRING

Thanks to Rowan Sawers and Ken Waters and their team who officiated all our games of football this year. Your contribution, commitment to development and valued support has been very much appreciated.



Thanks also to the parents and volunteers who assist in officiating our junior programmed matches and making these matches safe and enjoyable for our young participants.

Thanks also to Peter and the Umpires Association and all the umpires advisors and coaches for supporting the program.

TRIBUNAL/INVESTIGATION/MEMBER PROTECTION

Media

THE plan was to ensure the EDFL remained the best-covered competition in local football. I believe the EDFL's media team achieved this in 2016, but further growth and innovation will be key in coming years.

EDFL TEAM APP

The majority of all the EDFL's online traffic is now generated via mobile and hand-held devices – primarily smart phones. Therefore a key element we addressed in the off-season was the EDFL's official smart phone app. We introduced live scoring for all senior games across the three divisions, allowing anyone, anywhere to view live-to-the-minute scores from any senior game via EDFL Team App during the season. As a result, we enjoyed massive growth through EDFL Team App in 2016. From April to September, EDFL Team App was accessed more than 109,000 times. Compared to 2015, we had a total increase of more than 84,000 total hits. In August alone, EDFL Team App almost reached 32,000 hits.

ONLINE PRESENCE & SOCIAL MEDIA

The EDFL website remains one of the most popular among all local leagues across Australia. Our website currently ranks third Australia-wide. Data also indicates that among the top 10 most popular league websites, the EDFL has the second-fastest growing site. Overall, total traffic for the EDFL website is close to nine million. Recent data also indicates that 60 per cent of all traffic to the EDFL website comes via mobile and hand-held devices. That's the majority of users.

The reach of the EDFL's Facebook page enjoyed notable growth in 2016, going past 7000 likes on the day of the Division 2 Grand Final between Roxburgh Park and East Keilor. We started the year at 5,587 likes. On Twitter, the EDFL now has more than 4000 followers, ranked third among Victoria's six metropolitan leagues. On Instagram, we now have close to 3500 followers.

RADIO COVERAGE

The EDFL continues to enjoy a strong on-air partnership with North West FM. In 2016, we introduced a new radio show, aired every Wednesday night from 6pm to 7:30pm during the season. *EDFL Tonight with Adem Saricaoglu & Adrian Jamieson* was well-received and a rousing success, according to podcast figures. Full episodes of *EDFL Tonight* were released as podcasts every Thursday via Soundcloud. An average of more than 300 people listened to *EDFL Tonight* podcasts each week. A big thank you must go to my regular co-host, Adrian Jamieson. His commitment to the show both in preparation and live on the air made the show the success it was. Travis Poznachowski must also be acknowledged for the numerous appearances he made on the show as a stand-in co-host.

We as a league are very proud of *EDFL Match of the Day*. Along with the traditional live broadcast on North West FM, this year we introduced a new live online audio stream of *EDFL Match of the Day* via Mixlr, allowing us to instantly and

directly monitor our online listenership for the first time. Our fans had the ability to listen to live game-day coverage online via mobile and hand-held devices and social media. Via Mixlr only, more than 1500 people listened to our live grand final coverage across the three divisions (these numbers do not include the live North West FM audience).

For the first time in EDFL history, we broadcast a junior game – the Under 16 Division 1 Grand Final between Hillside and Aberfeldie. This broadcast was live and exclusive to Mixlr and well-received, with more than 300 people tuning in. The *EDFL Match of the Day* call team was one of the best I've worked with. Jake Equid returned to the team as a caller following a previous stint behind the mic in 2013. Jake took up opportunities elsewhere midway through the season, allowing Travis Poznachowski to step up and call his first Premier Division Grand Final alongside myself this year. In special comments we had Adrian Jamieson and Adam Russell again provide great insight, while Oak Park coach Ben Chapman again made himself available to do special comments for coverage of both the Premier Division and Division 1 Grand Finals. New-comers Michael Pepicelli and Damien Peck were very welcome additions to the coverage in 2016 and served as boundary riders for the year. North West FM panel operator John Dosen must also be acknowledged. He never missed an *EDFL Match of the Day* nor *EDFL Tonight* broadcast all season long as our panel operator back in the studio.

EDFL WEB TV

EDFL Web TV was deliberately scaled down in 2016 to focus mainly on game highlights. This year we eliminated the on-camera discussion segment. This proved a success, with the highlights-driven show generating increased viewership on Youtube. The highlights of the Under 16 Division 1 Grand Final were easily the most popular item on *EDFL Web TV* this year, generating 2000 views in just nine days. With the hope of more games being officially filmed by the league in 2017, *EDFL Web TV* will again undergo significant change.

Red Onion Creative's Corey Clemente was again our main camera operator for all broadcast games and the 2016 EDFL Awards Night. We again appreciate Corey's important contribution. The Pascoe Vale Hotel returned as the show's official venue partner, while Sportsmoves came on



board in 2016 as the show's official apparel supplier. The 'Sportsmoves Highlight of the Week' was a popular segment on the show throughout the year. A big thank you to both *EDFL Web TV* sponsors.

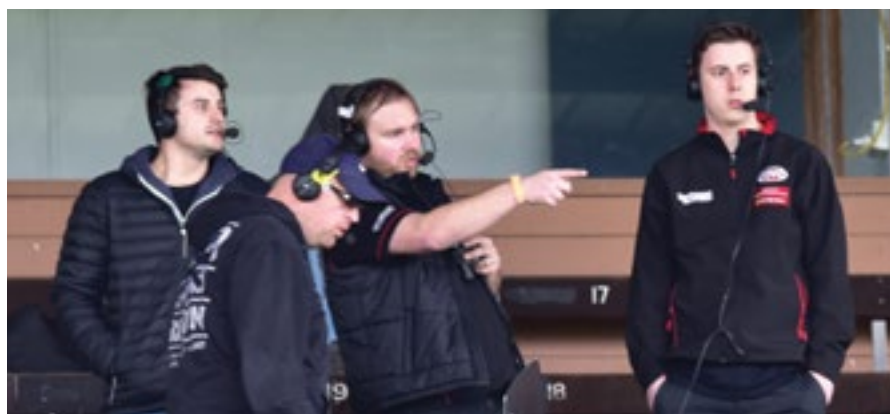
RECORD

Umpiring

FOR the 2016 season the EDFL Umpiring Plan aligned to the EDFL Strategic Plan, which identified a primary focus for the year in providing the community with opportunities to participate and enjoy Australian Rules Football.

The EDFL aims to:

- Increase the opportunities to participate in Australian Rules Football
- Develop and promote participation and talent pathways
- Strengthen and develop community links and connections with Australian Rules Football
- Educate the sport on the importance of umpires, recruiting and the development of people to become umpires, to ensure quality competitions can be played in a respectful environment and within the rules of Australian Rules Football

The Umpiring Department set about meeting the aims with the assistance of Hume, Moreland and Brimbank Councils, the AFL, AFL Victoria, Victorian Police, the Jim Stynes Foundation and most importantly, our EDFL clubs. The EDFL had over 520 registered umpires in 2016, a slight increase on last year's record high. This number makes the EDFL the largest community umpiring body in the state. This number is also a sharp increase on 2013 when the EDFL had approximately 350 registered umpires. Umpiring Youth Training Centres in Jacana, Delahey, Cole Reserve, the Australian Islamic Academy in North Coburg and St Bernard's College in Essendon, in addition to the training conducted at Windy Hill ensures maximum opportunity for people to take on umpiring within the EDFL region. These academies are a tremendous asset for the EDFL to engage umpires from all areas across the region.

EDFL JUNIOR UMPIRING

The EDFL currently has approximately 260 junior umpires, with 65 first-year umpires joining the program. The EDFL was able to cover every game this season, with 95 per cent of games having two umpires appointed.

An average of 210 appointments were made each weekend, totalling approximately 3500 across the season, including practice and Interleague matches. Two new Youth Training Centres located at Cole and Delahey Reserves were set up with the support of Moreland and Brimbank Councils.

The Jacana Centre continued to grow with the support of Hume Council and Victorian Police. A special thanks to Coburg Districts and Jacana Football Clubs for their support and making their club's facilities available on training nights.

Three EDFL umpires had opportunities to participate in the AFL Auskick Program and umpire at half time of AFL matches. Congratulations to Rose Corluka, Ashlee Gugala and Jarrod Overend. What a great experience!

Mohamad Soueid, Georgia Marsland, Tim Freeman and Thomas Dervan participated in an AFL game-day experience in visiting the AFL umpires change-rooms prior to a match, participating in their warm-up and

then walking on to the ground with the AFL umpires.

Our junior umpires visited Essendon Football Club training facility True Value Solar Centre for an AFL training experience. Many of our EDFL umpires took part in metropolitan representatives matches and school carnivals covering Under 13s, 14s, and 15s.

To continue to develop our junior umpires, the EDFL extended the three-umpire system to include all Under 16s footy in the last couple rounds and during the finals in the top three divisions. Development of these young umpires is imperative for preparing them for senior football in the future.

Through our talent selection pathway, we saw many of our top junior umpires embark on senior football umpiring careers in 2016, putting in place the skills learned through the Junior Program.

Special thanks to Brett Pallini (Head Junior Coach), Mark Volich, Kelvin French, Keith Ogston, Will Harris and Aden Kittel, our junior team of coaches. Our junior mentors play an important role on game-day in developing our junior brigade in what can at times be a negative environment.

The EDFL Junior Program is vital for the viability and our long-term growth of umpiring in the EDFL. We need our EDFL clubs and supporters to treat our umpires with respect, accept their decision and eliminate offensive behaviour.

EDFL UMPIRING

I would firstly like to acknowledge the EDFL clubs and coaches for their support of umpiring. Coaches have an impact beyond winning as they are the respected leader and have massive influence on all people within their club. As a coach they drive the attitudes and behaviours and they create the environment regarding sportsmanship and respect towards umpiring. The EDFL needs your continual support to grow umpiring within our league.

Every field, boundary and goal umpire, both new and those who have continued their umpiring with the EDFL, must be congratulated for their commitment and dedication to the EDFL, our clubs and to their fellow team members. Everyone plays a significant role and are a very valuable member of our team.

To my field umpire coaches Don Cooke, Steve Martin, Doug Drinkwater and Nathan Lessels, goal umpire coaches Tom Ennis, John Bladen and Neil McLean and boundary coach Stacey Cartwright-Smith – a special thanks goes to all of you for the countless hours of effort you all put in to improve and develop our umpiring team.

Thanks to Ken Waters, who is a tremendous support throughout the year. His knowledge is very valuable in the smooth operation of the Umpiring Department. The EDFLUA led by Peter Pearce provides a positive social environment and support mechanism for our umpires.

The support from Brett Scott and the EDFL Board is greatly appreciated by myself and the EDFL Umpiring Department. To Marc Turri and all my fellow team members at Windy Hill, thanks for all your support and

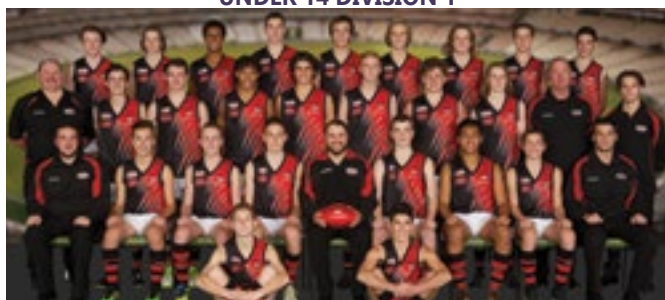

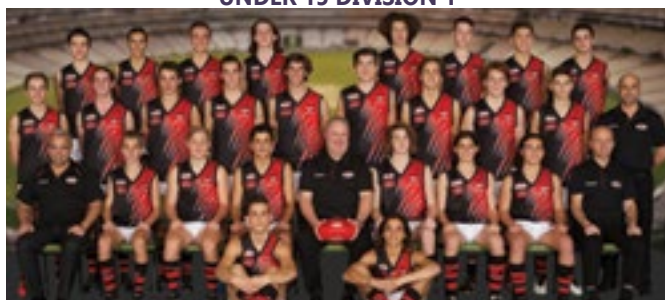

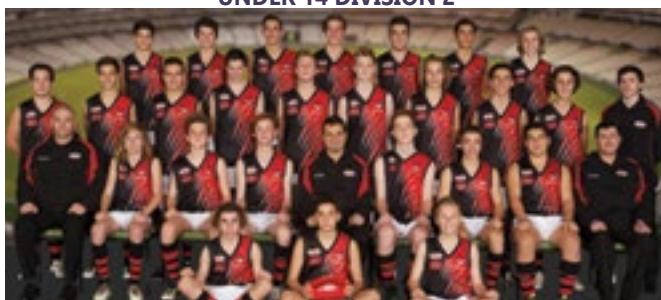

AFL Victoria Development

IT'S certainly been another year of growth, innovation and development for AFL Victoria in the North West region of Melbourne!

PERSONNEL

Mid-year saw another change of personnel in the region, with Chris Johnson departing to take up a role within AFL Victoria as the State Diversity Talent Manager. We thank Chris for his contribution to the game in the region and wish him all the best in his new role – no doubt he won't be a stranger to the EDFL! Gavin Mahony replaced Chris as the new Football Development Manager for the Melbourne Central region mid-season. We welcome Gavin to the region and look forward to him capitalising on the foundation laid by Chris.

SCHOOLS

This year has seen us again put a heavy focus on ensuring that our game has a very strong presence in as many local schools as possible. Our relationship with schools has continued to improve, and ultimately allowed us to run programs throughout the region involving interactions with over 20,000 students. The flagship of this suite of offers to schools remains the Australian Sports Commission's Sporting Schools Program, but also includes Auskick Assembly Promotions, Footy Frenzy Days, AFL 9's and one-off clinics, AFL player appearances and Multicultural School Programs. In addition, this year we were able to expand our AFL 9's Interscholar Competition that we introduced last year – the end result was the inaugural Primary Schools Challenge that saw our school teams progress from local competitions to compete against other schools from around Melbourne in a State Final at IKON Park – an incredible opportunity for our kids to play on an ex-AFL ground against great opposition.

MULTICULTURAL ENGAGEMENT

We have continued to strive to engage multicultural communities through a number of different initiatives throughout 2016. We again rolled out our Ahmed Saad Diversity Squad in conjunction with the Calder Cannons, putting 25 boys through a 10-week program that culminated in a round robin against other Diversity Squads from around the state – again, a very enriching program for all involved. We also ran a Multicultural Gala Day in Roxburgh Park which proved to be

highly successful, engaging over 200 local students in various activities including grid games, inflatables, rules explained in Arabic and a visit from North Melbourne FC players. Further to this, we ensured that the game had a presence at a number of different multicultural festivals and events throughout the region.

DISTRICT SCHEME

The cornerstone of our work around club development has been the establishment of a District Scheme that was presented to all clubs at an information evening in September. Clubs were presented with a number of different elements of data pertinent to their local district including school information, population & demographic data, as well various other generic information designed to make running clubs easier and reduce the burden on volunteers. We encourage all clubs to use this information to help create sustainable junior pathways through your local area.

CLUB IMPROVEMENT & COACHING

We have continued to work with clubs to complete the Club Improvement Program, but the uptake remains low within our region. This program is a fantastic tool designed to assist in all facets of your club and we implore committees to go through the process in 2017.

Ultimately we can do as much work as possible to attract participants to footy clubs, but if the environment is not conducive to retaining them they will be lost to the game. Hence the work we continue to do around increasing the quality of coaching remains integral to the growth of the game. Coaches play the most critical role in the experience many of us have, and clubs that are proactive in establishing positive environments are having success in the recruitment and retention of players, setting themselves up for sustained success.

In accordance with our focus on developing community coaches, AFL Victoria will be offering up a Positive Coaching Project opportunity in 2017 for coaches who are interested in better developing their skills to deliver the best development opportunities to the players in their team. This course will focus on best practice coaching activities, will utilise new learning technologies and provide a chance for the coach to continually improve their own skill set.

Our Coaching Co-Ordinator Program continues to evolve, and this year saw coaches given inner sanctum training and game-day experiences at the Calder Cannons. The uptake in this position is currently not where we would like it be, so we continue to encourage all clubs to invest time and effort into this position, who's primary responsibility is to oversee the entire junior coaching group. The Coaching Co-Ordinator establishes the learning and development environment for both the coaches and players while providing a consistency in coaching throughout the whole club.

AUSKICK

This year also saw our Auskick numbers continue to increase throughout the region, with a number of new centres opening up. A new centre was started at Tullamarine Indoor Sports Centre to provide a point of difference in the region, while an After School Centre was established at Gladstone Views Primary School to tap into this area of growth. We will continue to identify opportunities for new centres to ensure every community has a chance to engage in our game.

FEMALE FOOTBALL

This time last year a national women's AFL competition seemed a long way away, but now it is very much a reality as momentum continues to build every day in the lead-up to the inaugural AFL Women's competition that will kick off next year. The initial announcement, coupled with the buzz around the recent draft, will ensure that female footy remains front of mind for all involved in the game and clubs should be prepared for an influx of new female participants.

This year saw us run our first 'Female Footy Day' that was held on a Friday evening at Windy Hill in March. A fantastic night was had by all with Auskick clinics taking place, a training session conducted by the Calder Cannons Youth Girls Squad, lots of giveaways and information stands set up by local clubs. This proved to be a great launching pad for the year ahead! Next year will see the EDFL running their own junior female competition across Under 12s, Under 15s and Under 18s and we will be working closely with the league and clubs to ensure that this is a success. There is now a clear pathway for young female footballers which has resulted in this aspect of our sport being the fastest-growing, so it is imperative that we build a sustainable local competition that will ultimately act as a feeder to our national league.

Congratulations to everyone on the year – we hope that it was one filled with great memories and has left you with a strong appetite to remain involved in 2017. Thanks for all of your support and we hope you are able to enjoy the 'off' season!

FROM a Keilor Football Club viewpoint, the 2016 season was a very successful one for both our Junior and Senior Programs.

Of our 15 junior teams, which includes Under 12 & Under 15 Girls, 13 teams made finals, of which five made grand finals, to then achieve three premierships.

The importance of our Junior Program remains a clear and consistent focus with our football club. With 235 Auskickers and 15 under-age teams, the success of our Junior Program remains a critical platform for both junior and senior success now and into the future.

Of our five senior teams, our Seniors, Reserves, Senior Thirds and Under 18.5 Premier Division teams made finals and grand finals, with the Seniors winning our first flag since 2008 and our Reserves going back-to-back.
