

CEO's Perspective





FOR the only time this year, all three senior men's competitions will play finals this weekend. As is often the case, there are stories and questions surrounding matches across all three divisions. The highest stakes are in Strathmore Community Bank Division 2, where the Sunbury Kangaroos meet Moonee Valley in the Grand Final.

The match presents an interesting contrast from an EDFL perspective, with Moonee Valley Football Club

having been a long-term part of the EDFL fraternity, and the Sunbury Kangaroos playing in their first year of EDFL football.

The Kangaroos have not lost a match throughout the home-and-away season or finals series.

When the two teams played in Round 8, the Kangaroos won by eight goals at home.

Late in the season at Ormond Park, Sunbury were the victors by 29 points having led by one point at half time.

Can Moonee Valley cause one of the bigger upsets in recent EDFL history?

Congratulations to the Sunbury Kangaroos, who have also qualified for the Division 2 Reserves Grand Final, where they meet the Northern Saints.

The Saints finished the home-andaway rounds on top of the ladder and the final margin when these teams met in the second semi final was only eight points.

It looks like being a tight encounter. Many long-term EDFL stalwarts are claiming the Strathmore Community Bank Premier Division competition is a race in two, being the Aberfeldie and Keilor football clubs.

The next three weeks will determine how accurate that

assessment is.

A fact which cannot be argued is that for the past five years, the team who has won the Strathmore Community Bank Premier Division second semi final has gone on to win the decider

Trends can always be broken, however the winner of their match this weekend will certainly feel more comfortable

In the Premier Division first semifinal, Strathmore will enjoy the opportunity to return to the finals after their heart breaking two-point prelim loss in 2018.

This year marks Pascoe Vale Football Club's return to finals, having missed the last two years following back-to-back finals appearances in 2015 and 2016. The Division 1 Preliminary Final also looks like being a close matchup.

East Keilor will be disappointed at losing the second semi final having finished the home-andaway season two games clear on top, while Tullamarine finished their semi final very strongly.

The results were shared when these two teams met during the home-and-away season.





Kangaroos Sweating On Injuries

SUNBURY Kangaroos are sweating on the fitness of their two leading forwards ahead of the Strathmore Community Bank Division 2 Grand Final at Windy Hill.

Lachie Baddeley (knee) and Josh Burgess (leg) were both on crutches in the days following their team's major semi-final victory over Moonee Valley.

If the pair, who have kicked 100 goals between them in 2019, are ruled out, it would be a major blow, but the Kangaroos did defeat the Fog in the final round of the home-and-away season without both players.

Baddeley and Burgess combined for three majors in the 32-point win over Moonee Valley in the first week of finals.

Coach Anthony Leydin said his hungry team was determined to convert an undefeated season into the ultimate prize as it prepares to tackle the Fog for the third time in four weeks.

"They're very driven," Leydin said of his group.

"I've probably got the easiest job in coaching. I just point them to the oval and they get out there and do their stuff.

"Obviously we think we're well organised and structured and play to a certain pattern.

"We think that holds up in the pressure of finals football, but until you do it, you never can tell.

"It's probably the most experienced team

I've coached and that does make it easier on the coaching staff because they (the players) are setting the example and leading the charge, and hopefully that's what wins you the big games."

The Kangaroos will enter the grand final as a red-hot favourite after a perfect 15-0 home-and-away campaign and semi-final triumph.

Expectation has enveloped the club since it made the switch from the RDFL and was placed in the EDFL's third tier.

A fruitful off-season of recruiting meant the Kangaroos were a flag fancy from the first bounce of 2019 — and they have justified the hype.

"It's one thing to be pre-season favourite and it's one thing to be talked about, but it's another thing actually doing it," Leydin said.

"So far we have. We know the next game is going to be the biggest challenge for us, but regardless of what happens in that period, I still couldn't be more proud of the players to have done what they've done already.

"We had 13 players (in the semi final) that hadn't played footy with each other before, so that's a lot of chemistry you've got to try and build, a lot camaraderie you've got to build over a short period of time.

"The pleasing thing is ... they've done that. They really enjoy playing with each other and hopefully we can share in some success together."

Valley Secures First Shot At Flag In Two Decades

MOONEE Valley has earned another shot at taking down flag favourite Sunbury Kangaroos after advancing to the Strathmore Community Bank Division 2 Grand Final.

The pair will meet for a third time in four weeks after the Fog scored a crushing 68-point victory over Burnside Heights in Saturday's Preliminary Final at Coburg City Oval.

Moonee Valley went down to the undefeated Kangaroos by 32 points in the major semi-final and lost by 29 points in Round 18.

Shanon Carroll's side was on the receiving end of an eight-goal defeat when the two teams met in Round 8.

Rocky Ferraro will play in the decider having not taken the field since July 20, while Jordan Faba returned with a fivegoal haul against the Bears.

With Kangaroos pair Lachlan Baddeley and Josh Burgess in doubt for the Grand Final, the Fog are full of confidence as they chase their first senior premiership in two decades.

Carroll said he was "proud and relieved" after the 18.12-120 to 7.10-52 victory over Burnside Heights.

"We thought we finished second for a reason and (last week) was probably vindication of that. Everything came to fruition," Carroll said.

"It was most pleasing to stand back and watch the faces of the boys as they were walking off the ground.

"I think the belief is really there with the boys now.

"Watching them walk off, it was such a proud moment as a coach to see they believe we can go all the way if we put another performance like that together."

The versatile Braden Padmore (three goals), Cory McGrath, Luke Ryan, Faba and Ned Wilson were named Moonee Valley's best.

You won't see the Fog lose too many games when their blue-chip performers fire

Carroll heaped praise on Michael Bourke for his "absolutely brilliant" job on Josh Covelli, who was held goalless.

James Moussa blanketed Anthony Fawcus, who also failed to contribute a major, in another big win.

While the Kangaroos have injury concerns, Carroll is acutely aware the minor premier boasts class all over the ground.

"They've got the depth to be able to cover that," he said.

"We'll be lining up as if they're full strength."

Preview | Strathmore Community Bank Division 2 Grand Final

SUNBURY KANGAROOS v MOONEE VALLEY Saturday 2:15pm at Windy Hill

WHAT will it take for Moonee Valley to pull off an extraordinary upset?

The Sunbury Kangaroos took Strathmore Community Bank Division 2 by storm this season and coming into Grand Final Day, no one has been able to beat them yet.

They were at their clinical best two weeks ago against the Fog in the second semi, but Sunbury didn't come away with its 32-point win completely unscathed.

Sunbury's two leading goal kickers Lachie Baddeley and Josh Burgess will enter the decider under an injury cloud while others, including David House, have ongoing niggles of their own.

You'd have little doubt there are some Moonee Valley players carrying niggles of their own, but surely the Fog could find an advantage if a handful of key Kangaroos take the field at less than 100 per cent.

Both sides have solid depth and plenty of match winners who could make Windy Hill their own.

For Sunbury, Brenton Sutherland's influence in the ruck will be huge, while the likes of Matt Quigley and Tierone Cuffe could likely be shrugging off tags throughout the day.

The Valley have a few aces up their sleeves as well, with Cory McGrath, Ned Wilson and Braden Padmore all capable of doing damage in all parts of the ground.

The expected wet weather leading into the weekend could also play into the Valley's hands, as Sunbury prides itself on its ability

to spread and hurt you on the burst.

As the second semi started to tilt the Kangaroos' way, they were able to move the ball freely from coast to coast and hurt Moonee Valley on the scoreboard.

The wider expanses of Windy Hill will suit Sunbury's preferred avenues to goal so it's vitally important for the Fog to stick to their structures throughout the day.

Windy Hill takes rain very well, so the track won't get too heavy.

It will be slippery, however, so good ball use and skill execution will be at a premium.

Winning the hard ball will be as important as ever but once it gets on the outside, the game could come down to who better executes when going into attack.

Sunbury's overall experience and physicality could tip the game in the Kangaroos' favour, but if their execution is off, then Moonee Valley will be in the game.

Fog forwards Jordan Faba and Rocky Ferraro both did not play in the second semi and the game remained close for a half, before the Roos eventually kicked clear.

Faba returned for last week's prelim and booted five against Burnside Heights, while Ferraro was part of the selected 25 but did not take the field.

If both line-up here, then Daniel Gregory and his fellow Sunbury defenders need to be on top of their game.

If most individual match-ups inside 50 break even, then the game could be won in midfield and that is where Sunbury will look to find an edge with its superior depth.

When you look at the abundance of talent they have running around the park, it's not too hard to see why they've been so good for so long.

EDFL Media analyst, Kaine Hocking, has revealed his five most important Sunbury players for the decider.

#7 - LACHLAN BADDELEY (pictured)

One of Sunbury's big off-season recruits has proved to be a key part of the Kangaroos' forward structure.

After playing just five games and booting 10 goals last year at St Albans, Season 2019 has been a good return at 'The Pouch' for Baddeley, slotting 57 goals from his 15 games in blue and white thus far.

Baddeley looms as a dangerous threat in several roles inside 50.

Whether he plays as a high half forward or one out from the goal square, he's a difficult man to mark, as he can play both small and tall.

He's a strong candidate for Team of the Year selection and will again be a handful for Carroll and his men at Windy Hill, not only roaming through the midfield but with his ability to push forward and provide yet another dangerous target inside 50.

Gregory, Faba will look to get busy and hit the scoreboard early for his side.

This season has been a consistent one for Faba, having only been kept goalless twice.

When he runs out on Saturday, it will be the most senior games he has played in one season and three goals will see him produce his biggest return for a season since debuting in senior football.

For the Valley to bring the premiership back to Ormond Park, Faba will need to fill his boots, similar to the way he did with five goals in the prelim.





Vavra's consistency in ruck has been particularly noteworthy throughout the year and he'll be looking to gain an edge on the likes of Jesse Boyd and Daniel Archer

The midfield battle looms as an intriguing one here, as many Pascoe Vale's A-graders are finding form at the right time of year as well.

Erroll McConnell and Matt Stillman both starred in last week's dead rubber win over Airport West, while Liam Ogden and Michael Ross are dangerous attacking mids that know how to kick goals.

Strathmore coach Matthew Horne will no doubt be wary of Pascoe Vale's ability to spread its goal kicking load.

The two home-and-away meetings are split at 1-1 and both were blowout wins, so we have ourselves a genuine coin flipper here at Coburg City Oval.

Whoever wins will play in next week's Preliminary

Final and will have a genuine shot of advancing to the decider, so the stakes are very high.

KEILOR v ABERFELDIE Sunday 2:15pm at Windy Hill

An ongoing hamstring complaint for the division's best forward, Dean Galea, looms as the biggest talking point coming into this week's second semi.

Galea has rarely missed games in the past but this season, the Blues spearhead has only played 15 of 18 home-and-away fixtures.

Last week's clash against Maribyrnong Park was the third game he's missed this year.

His inclusion here is expected to remain touch and go until game time, but regardless of whether he steps onto Windy Hill or not, Aberfeldie can't afford to rest on its laurels

Keilor is still 3-0 without Galea this season and in last week's 26-point win at Monk Oval, Matthew Clark and David Gourdis both stepped up to kick three goals apiece.

Both Clark and Gourdis are a dangerous forward combo in their own right and it will be fascinating to see how Aberfeldie chooses to utilise the likes of Ryan Allan, Josh Toy, Daniel Thompson (if he doesn't start in the forward line) and Jacob Craven (if he returns after missing Round 18).

Further up the ground, Keilor is getting fantastic value out of Kane Barbuto, Brett Stillman, David Isbister and Dylan Joyce and all of their extensive finals experience will hold the undefeated Blues in good stead this September.

But Aberfeldie has a wealth of experience as well.

Midfield stars Jaryd Cachia and Luke Blackwell have again had wonderful individual seasons and Cachia in particular will be hungry for a big September, having been part of Strathmore's heart-breaking prelim loss to Keilor last year.

He is in search of his first premiership medal since joining the competition in 2017 and will be a hard man for Keilor to stop.

Keilor doesn't have anything to prove after completing a perfect home-and-away season, but Aberfeldie hasn't lost a final since the 2016 grand final – which was won by Keilor.

This really could go either way.


