

Chairman's Report

HE Essendon District Football League has experienced another strong year. The continued growth in female football is credit to all clubs which have embraced it.

Football

Across the three senior men's competitions, we saw the rare feat of Premiers & Champions completed by both Keilor (Premier Division) and the Sunbury Kangaroos (Division 2). Congratulations to both clubs on a magnificent feat. Division 1 was won by Craigieburn, beating the form side for the year, East Keilor. Congratulations to the Eagles. An important development this season was the re-emergence of Keilor Park after a year in recess and there are encouraging signs that the club will have two senior teams competing next season. This addition was unfortunately offset by the withdrawal of Jacana from the Division 2 competition midway through the season. The league is assisting the club in its efforts to return to the senior competition with a particular focus on building and improving its volunteer and junior base.

Our women's competitions continue to grow in strength, with two divisions of 10 teams in Season 2019 compared to one division of 13 teams in the previous season. Congratulations to Aberfeldie in Premier Division and Essendon Doutta Stars in Division 1. Aberfeldie's Premier women's team also went Premier & Champions. The success at senior level is very much tied to the development of juniors through planned and focussed junior development programs and clubs are very much encouraged to focus their efforts on this important area of club administration.

Umpires

Our umpiring department is second to none and continues to meet the needs of our competitions and congratulations go to the work of Rowan Sawers and his team, which works tirelessly over the year, particularly in coordinating umpiring academies so essential to the recruitment of junior umpires.

Netbal

This season saw the inaugural EDFL netball competition commence with two divisions. In partnership with the Essendon District Netball Association, the competitions were conducted at the netball courts at Aberfeldie. Aberfeldie Sports Club fielded teams in both divisions and ended up claiming both premierships. Well done and congratulations.

Future Development - Competitions

This year was the third season under which both the Player Points System and the Player Payments System have operated. It is time for the league, in consultation with the clubs, to examine the performance of our competitions and the individual clubs against the strategic objectives of these systems. With the increasing number of teams involved in our competitions and the finite number of ovals, it is important that the clubs and the league work together in maximising the use of the ovals by innovative and flexible fixturing. These approaches could open opportunities for new or increased revenue sources for clubs.

Windy Hill Redevelopment

The league, through the work of Craig Armstead and Jan Chantry, has been actively involved in the user and community group consultations of the Imagine Windy Hill Project undertaken by the Moonee Valley Council. The aim of this project is to create a single long-term vision for Windy Hill with input from current user groups and the community guiding the future of this space towards 2040. The league's current and future participation in this project is an important step towards ensuring our voice is heard and that the continued and hopefully greater use of Windy Hill by our competition is embraced as an essential part of the community's use of Windy Hill.

Municipal Partners

It is extremely important for our league, together with our clubs, to maintain good relations with the councils operating in the areas covered by our competition, namely Moonee Valley, Moreland, Melton, Hume and Brimbank. These councils are important partners in the development of our sporting facilities and on behalf of the league, I want to express our thanks to each of these councils for the vital work they each do in investing in ovals, changeroom and social facilities (such as improved lighting), as well as the general support extended to our clubs.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank

each of my fellow board members for the work they have put in this year as the board continues its transition to a more strategic role. My thanks to Tanya Taylor, Andrea Tacono, Jan Chantry, Romy Gutbier, Rob Castellas and Steele Waterman. One aspect of the election of board members last year that reoccurs with this coming year's election of board members puts a light on the operation of Rule 9. Whilst it provides that board members will each serve for a two-year term, three members must retire each odd year and four members each even year. So this year, as was the case last year, a board member with only one year's service will need to stand for re-election. This is unsatisfactory and needs to be addressed. Romy Gutbier, after eight years on the board, will retire and not stand for re-election and



instead return to club land. Romy has made a very valuable contribution with his depth of knowledge of the competition and his dedicated and cautious approach to the league's finances as treasurer since 2017. Thank you and well done. Rob Castellas is also stepping down after five years. I would like to acknowledge Rob's dedication to the league and his board.

five years. I would like to acknowledge Rob' dedication to the league and his board role over that period and in particular, to his active interest and role in maintaining the reputation of the league as a premier metropolitan football competition.

Life Membership

This year the league, with the support and cooperation of the clubs, made Geoff Brown a life member of the EDFL. Geoff was presented with his medallion at the EDFL Season Launch and his award was unanimously acclaimed by all who attended. It was testament to the high regard with which he is held by the EDFL and all clubs for his tireless support of league activities, in which he selflessly contributed to.

EDFL Clubs

To all the clubs and in particular, club presidents and your committees, thank you for your contributions to the league and our strong competitions.

John Larkins, after more than 20 years as president of Aberfeldie, has decided to retire from that role. I extend my congratulations and sincere thanks for the enormous contribution made to your club and to the EDFL, in particular your participation on the Rules Sub-Committee and the many other less formal roles you performed. John is a true gentleman and an indomitable and intrepid supporter of his club and the EDFL.

Chief Executive Report

EASON 2019 demonstrated the growing diversity and breadth of EDFL competitions and therefore, the requirements on our organisation. It was pleasing to witness many successes on and off the field. Growth and change bring challenges which we will continue to embrace and work closely with our stakeholders to find the best solutions.

Growth

Another year of growth was very pleasing, where over the past three years we have added 96 teams to our football competitions. Female participation continues to grow and it's fantastic to see the positive impact our female players are having at their clubs and throughout the EDFL. In 2019, female teams represented 21 per cent of EDFL football. An area for concern has been the decrease in the number of teams competing in our Under 19 competitions. Following analysis and discussions with our clubs, the decision was made to convert the age group to an Under 18.5 competition for 2020. We expect this will lead to more players in this important age bracket next year.

Further to this change to Under 18.5, all junior boys age groups will move from 'odd' to 'even' numbers for 2020 (and junior girls in 2021). This will mean our youngest competitions will be Under 8, which we expect will mean a higher percentage of boys and girls transition into club football when they complete Auskick.

In senior football, six clubs fielded their first senior women's teams, including Coburg Districts, Essendon Doutta Stars, Greenvale, Maribyrnong Park, Moonee Valley, and Tullamarine, and we welcomed the Sunbury Kangaroos' men's teams as well, who played in the EDFL for the first time.

Netball competitions commenced in 2019, which was an important strategic initiative for us. It was fantastic to watch netball matches being played and to see a new sport and additional players joining the EDFL.

Strategic Plan

A key activity for 2019 was to prepare a new five-year Strategic Plan for the EDFL. Whilst the previous plan covered years 2016 to 2020, the changes in our industry and competitions were so significant we felt it important to prepare a new plan. The EDFL Strategic Plan 2020 – 2024 will provide important direction for all parties. Development of this strategic plan involved input from all our stakeholders. Many people provided their time and thoughts by attending workshops, completing surveys and at meetings, which was very valuable and much appreciated. We all enjoy being part of the EDFL and care about the future progress of our clubs, the league, our partners and all of the people involved.

Infrastructure & Clubs

Continued expansion of our competitions is creating more pressure on club infrastructure. It was satisfying to see many projects being undertaken this year. Developments, including new and upgraded change rooms, social facilities, lighting, amenities and grounds, are all vitally important to ensuring we continue to deliver the best possible community sporting opportunities. The five Local Government Agencies where EDFL clubs are based are critical to the ongoing success of the EDFL. We thank them for their assistance in our club operations and with these infrastructure projects. While welcoming new clubs to the EDFL, supporting our existing clubs wherever we can will always remain a high priority. This assistance takes many forms. Indicators for the EDFL are the diversity of clubs whose teams play in grand finals and which clubs provide players who are successful in our league best-and-fairest awards. In 2019, we were very happy that 24 clubs competed in football grand finals and the winners and runners-up in EDFL best-and-fairest awards came from 28 different clubs. This reflects the quality of people involved with our clubs and the benefits of running divisional based competitions across senior and junior

EDFL Partners

The Strathmore Community Bank again made a massive contribution to our competition through their support of the EDFL, so many of our clubs and the EDFL Umpires Association. The amazing support of the Strathmore Community Bank also benefits the wider community. We enjoy the support and friendship of chair Peter Brown and all the directors and bank staff.

We must also acknowledge the continued support from AGA Apprenticeships Plus as the naming rights sponsor of the EDFL's Under 19 competitions and our Rising Star awards.

This year we were delighted that five organisations commenced partnerships with the EDFL, including 460degrees, Arctic Foods, Ausbright Facilities Management, Bizcore, and the TAC.

Thanks to our suite of other sponsors, which includes Ageless Herbals, Ascot Vale Sports & Trophies, Brad Teal Real Estate, Club Warehouse, Essendon Football Club, Game Day Apparel, Glenroy Bakery, Grashan Sportswear, Personal Graffiti, Red Onion Creative, SEDA, Sherrin, Sportsmoves, The Meadows, and The Valley. We are extremely appreciative of your support.

Financial Results

A disappointment from 2019 was that the EDFL recorded a significant loss for the year. In 2018 we achieved a sizable profit of



\$130,410, which reflected a lack of resources and investment in some areas. These issues were addressed this year and when added to some one-off impacts, resulted in a major loss for 2019. While the combined financial result across the two years reflects a profit, it is vital that we return to at least a 'break even' position for 2020. While the EDFL is a 'Non for Profit' organisation, we must ensure we have a financially viable and sustainable business operating model.

Appreciation

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the EDFL Chair, Bernie Shinners, and the Board of Management for their direction and support. Also, my appreciation to the EDFL and AFL Victoria staff members for their hard work and assistance during the year: Shane Abdilla, Pauline Leslie, Greta May, Patrick Moloney, Mark Morgan, Taylah Morris, Chantelle Raniolo, Adem Saricaoglu, Rowan Sawers, Ken Waters and Steve Webb. During the year we welcomed Steve Webb as our Football Operations Manager, who made a great contribution through his input and as a member of our team.

I would like to acknowledge the support of AFL Victoria staff and other important stakeholders who have assisted the EDFL this year including Brimbank, Hume, Melton, Moonee Valley, and Moreland Councils, the EDFL Umpires Association, our tribunal and appeals board members, the Essendon Football and Cricket Clubs and the two NAB League clubs in our region, the Calder Cannons and Western Jets.

Thanks all for your contributions to a fantastic year and I look forward to 2020, where we will celebrate the EDFL's 90th anniversary.

Football Operations Report

THE football operations team acknowledges every person in our EDFL community who volunteered their time and efforts towards their team, club or the broader EDFL community in Season 2019. Without every one of you, we could not operate such a wonderful community football and netball league.

Season Summary

On and off the field, the 2019 EDFL football season was a very successful year. Several new clubs entered teams in the EDFL Women's competition, bringing us to two divisions. The league also experienced continued growth and development of girls football, highlighted by a dedicated finals venue that hosted most of the girls finals at Airport West. The effectiveness of communication between the EDFL and clubs was improved and a highly successful finals campaign was also conducted, bringing to a close a very busy year for the football operations team.

There was great support for themed rounds throughout the season, however the Sock It To MND and Towards Zero rounds were the most well supported by our clubs. Football seasons do not run smoothly without a great team of people involved, and for this I would like to particularly thank Taylah Morris, Ken Waters and Pauline Leslie for their tireless efforts and unwavering energy towards community footy. In addition, Dave McWilliam and Allan Taylor, who keep our tribunal flowing smoothly each week, along with all the volunteer tribunal and appeals panel members, should also be commended. We got through our first season together with flying colours. Well done! Passion is a term which at times in football can be used for positive and can also have negative connotations, as there is a fine line between being parochial about team or club and being aggressively passionate and

tunnel viewed. This is largely why the football operations team were very supportive of the 'Don't Be That Parent' campaign, which was established by Moonee Valley FC. Everyone involved in community football should be able to enjoy the experience and their participation, whether they're players, umpires, coaches, officials or spectators. Whilst culturally for many years it seems to have been acceptable at AFL matches to abuse umpires and opposition players from the sidelines, this behaviour is totally unacceptable at community football and we will continue to work collaboratively with Rowan Sawers, Patrick Moloney and the rest of the umpiring group to help eradicate umpire abuse and poor behaviour. The change in format for junior presentations, whilst a little tight for space with the numbers in attendance, was a successful event and one that we will look to further improve upon. Pascoe Vale FC were very gracious and accommodating hosts at short notice and certainly assisted to deliver a great event for the award recipients.

Junior Metropolitan Development Series

AFL Victoria changed the format of the Under 14 & Under 15 'interleague' structure in Season 2019 to place the emphasis on development rather than on a championship. This brought about a name change for the competition to the 'AFL Victoria Metropolitan Development Series'. The EDFL had four boys and two girls teams compete in the series of three matches against other leagues. All feedback received from coaching staff and parents was very positive in relation to the overall experience for the players. Avondale Heights, Westmeadows and Airport West were sensational hosts, providing great facilities and operating their canteen for the crowds attending. Our gratitude also goes to the volunteer coaches and team officials who gave up their valuable knowledge and time



to help develop these squads.
The EDFL also hosted the traditional Under 13 Queens Birthday Interleague matches against the WRFL and RDFNL with the fantastic help of Burnside Heights FC. There is definitely a great depth of talent coming through the juniors and it was terrific to see several girls selected on merit to play amongst the boys in these squads.

Season 2020

We anticipate Season 2020 will bring another increase in female participation in both football and netball competitions managed by the EDFL, and we look forward to welcoming the VU Western Spurs and Diggers Rest senior women's teams into the EDFL, along with the Sunbury Kangaroos' junior girls. These club movements further strengthen our women's football competitions and demonstrate that the EDFL is providing a quality competition which is appealing to many clubs.

Some exciting initiatives and key dates to mark down in your diary will include the 90th Anniversary Celebration Round, a Friday Night EDFL Women's Highlight Round, several home-and-away matches fixtured at Windy Hill along with matches fixtured on the Queen's Birthday long weekend, Good Friday and ANZAC Day. We will also look to continue to build on several themed rounds, such as the Sock it to MND and Towards Zero rounds.

With Season 2020 planning well underway, we look forward to meeting all new committee members as well as continuing to work with those returning for what is the EDFL's 90th year of providing a great community sporting league.

Media Report

EASON 2019 was unlike any other for EDFL Media, with the league's entire media strategy undergoing substantial change. While we weren't the only league to do it, the removal of the weekly record, The Footballer, for the 2019 home-and-away season was a tremendously difficult decision to make. We knew removing the record for the home-and-away season would not play well with the general public. However, it would have been neglectful of us to ignore the fact that readership had been in steady decline and in the view of many of our clubs, the record had become a financial burden in recent years.

The league's new media strategy was focussed heavily on growing its digital output via online and social media platforms. Thanks to the increased level of resourcing focussed on digital content as a direct result of the removal of the record, 2019 was by far EDFL Media's most successful year since I joined the league full-time in 2015.

Website & App Growth

Overall traffic on essendondfl.com.au grew by 11.98 per cent for the 2019 season (March to September), with the overall hits total reaching 7.96 million in that seven-month period. This was a tremendous result. While regular weekly items EDFL Teams and EDFL Headlines again performed well, much of this year's growth was generated via our revamped Gameday Central Hub, which provided access to live scores, live coverage and other matchday information for each senior matchday during the season. With the introduction of a second EDFL Women's division came the need for more preview and review content on essendondfl. com.au. Former EDFL staff member, Shannon Colgan, served as our official EDFL Women's reporter and did a splendid job in covering the two women's divisions this year. I'd also like to thank Tara Murray for again providing the weekly Division 1 men's preview article. The EDFL Live App also produced record numbers in 2019, with the app generating more than 499,000 hits from April to September. More than 15,000 EDFL fans are now connected to the app.

Social Media Growth

The EDFL's three major social media pages experienced significantly increased levels of growth in 2019. Total likes for the EDFL's Facebook page grew by more than 15 per cent in 2019, reaching more than 11,800 likes by the end of September. Our growth rate on Facebook in 2018 was 11 per cent, indicating a significant jump in popularity this year. Our growth rate for followers on Twitter and Instagram also improved on the figures from 2018, with Twitter growing by three per cent in 2019 (compared to two per cent in 2018) and Instagram producing an impressive 24

per cent jump in followers (compared to 14 per cent in 2018).

The two key factors in these significant levels of growth were the introduction of live *EDFL Match of the Day* broadcast streams via Facebook Live and the resultant increased volume of game highlights published on all three platforms.

These unprecedented levels of overall digital growth serve as solid proof that the EDFL and its clubs must support our continued commitment and investment in the professional filming of senior games – something we have historically been too slow to fully embrace in comparison to neighbouring leagues and rival sports. The league is planning to again expand its match filming program in 2020.

Radio & Live Stream Coverage

Firstly, I'd like to congratulate my colleagues on *EDFL Match of the Day* for claiming the 2018 AFL Victoria Community Media Award for 'Best Radio Match Day Coverage'. This was thoroughly deserved recognition for the call team and was the EDFL's first win in the category since 2012.

I'm extremely proud of the fact that the 2019 EDFL Match of the Day call team remained unchanged from 2018, resulting in another outstanding season of broadcasting. The coverage was again led brilliantly by play-byplay callers Travis Poznachowski, Tim Solly and Michael Pepicelli, while Kaine Hocking again served as our lead special comments man. I'd also like to thank Adam Russell, Tara Murray, Shannon Colgan, Ben McManus and Teo Pellizzeri for their contributions to the coverage throughout the season. The added logistical challenges that came with live streaming EDFL Match of the Day on Facebook Live alongside the traditional radio version of the coverage did prove tricky to overcome, but the entire team, both on air and behind the scenes, rose to the occasion with aplomb. Twenty-two of this year's 32 EDFL Match of the Day broadcast games were live streamed on Facebook and simulcast on 98.9 North West FM, with another six games broadcast exclusively on 98.9 North West FM and a further four games live streamed exclusively to Facebook. Our 26 Facebook Live games garnered more than 128,000 views for the season, with an average of close to 5000 views per game. In September, the average number of views per game grew to more than 11,600. Never before has EDFL football been exposed to such a large weekly audience.

From SportsCast Australia, I'd like to thank Andrew McLeish and his entire team of camera operators and producers for their outstanding work on the live stream coverage this year.

From our traditional radio partner, 98.9 North West FM, I'd also like to extend my



appreciation to panel operator, John Dosen, for his tireless work in ensuring *EDFL Match* of the Day got to air each week.

Podcasts

The EDFL Tonight Podcast was another huge success story for EDFL Media in 2019. The show's fourth season was its most successful yet, with our weekly average audience growing by a substantial 25 per cent. Over 32 total episodes in 2019, the EDFL Tonight Podcast averaged 535 listens per episode, which is a significant number for the league. Kaine Hocking replaced Adam Papal and did an outstanding job on the show alongside Adam Russell and I for the entire season. For the first time in 2019, we introduced a dedicated EDFL Women's edition of the EDFL Tonight Podcast, with five special editions of the show hosted by Tara Murray and Shannon Colgan during and after the EDFL Women's Finals Series. These EDFL Women's editions of the show proved very popular and introduced a new audience to the EDFL Tonight product.

Photography

Jamie Morey again served as the league's official and exclusive matchday and event photo supplier in 2019. His work is featured prominently throughout this document and across all EDFL digital and print products. Jamie works extremely hard on his craft and I thoroughly enjoy working alongside him each year. Long may it continue.

I'd like to thank everyone at SportsCast Australia, 98.9 North West FM, SportsTG, Team App, Red Onion Creative and Invicium for their continued support of the league.

Umpiring Report

OR the 2019 season, I'd like to thank every EDFL goal, boundary and field umpire. You are all to be congratulated for your commitment, resilience and dedication to the EDFL. Everyone involved in our umpiring organisation plays a significant role and each of you are respected as a very valuable member of our team.

Junior Program

The EDFL junior program is vital for the viability and long-term growth of umpiring in the EDFL. We need our EDFL clubs and supporters to treat our umpires with respect and to accept their decisions whilst at the same time, urging them to eliminate offensive behaviour.

I would like to acknowledge the EDFL clubs who became part of the 'No Ball for Junior Football' initiative. This supporter program encouraged supporters to use terms likes "great mark", "awesome tackle" and "fantastic kick" instead of yelling "ball" or "umpire". This is now part of the broader awareness campaign known as 'Don't Be That Parent'. I would like to expand this initiative in 2020 to all EDFL matches and to also focus this message on coaches as well as spectators. We need coaches to coach, the spectators to barrack and to let the umpires do their role. We encourage participants to not call out "ball" or "umpire", especially from the coaching box. As we all know, the coach at community level is the most powerful and influential person both on and off the field. Other participants mirror the coach's behaviour on game day, so let's set the example and tone for the environment we want our games to be played in. This is an ambitious initiative, but it is worth

a try. We simply can't afford to keep losing

umpires due to bad game day experiences.

Coaches

Thanks to our umpire coaches, mentors and volunteers who play a pivotal part in preparing all our umpires for the challenges that may occur on game day. Special thanks to the mentors and volunteers who give their time to help support our umpiring programs. Special thanks to Brett Pallini, who has led our junior coaching team in a very professional manner for the past six seasons. The junior program is a significant operation each week and takes many people to commit their time and energy to ensure its success and seamless operation. The program offers many opportunities for not only umpiring, but also personal development. We currently have over 30 coaches and mentors overseeing our junior program. These include our academy coaches Mark Volich (Ilim & AIA College), Nathan Toner (Moreland), Matt O'Connor and Don Cooke (St Bernards), Steve Marrari (Craigieburn), Troy McCarthy and Gavin Dovey (Jacana),

Daniel Wardley (Sunbury) and Keith Ogston (Delahev).

Our junior coaches at Windy Hill include James Downing, Laura Emerson, Michael Knight, Matt O'Connor, Don Cooke and Mark Volich (Coordinator of Academies). Thanks to all my junior coaches for their commitment to training and their involvement on Sundays. Thanks to Hayley Pallini for her time in supporting our junior

To senior field umpire coaches Don Cooke, Steve Martin, Doug Drinkwater, goal umpire coaches Tom Ennis, John Bladen and Leigh Keen and boundary coaches Shane Mallia and Dom Strambolini, thanks for the countless hours you all commit to umpires in the EDFL. This is a thankless task but your effort and dedication in developing our umpiring team does not go unnoticed. A special mention goes to Doug Drinkwater, who has recently retired from coaching, for his unwavering sponsorship of umpiring and his commitment on and off the field.

New Umpiring Academies

Ilim College, an Islamic college, saw 30 students training with a number being successful in umpiring matches in 2019. Further training will see more students involved in 2020.

The EDFL also assisted in a trial with Victoria University (VU) to promote a women's umpiring program late in the season. Six students took part with three joining for the 2020 season. VU funded the program with the EDFL supplying the coaches.

- Umpired in State School Championships and Herald Sun Shield matches held at RAMS Arena
- AFL and VFL umpires conducted training sessions at Windy Hill
- Hayden Kennedy, AFL umpire's coach and Andrew Coates, former AFL umpire, addressed our junior umpires at their presentation night

Female Football Report

T was another exciting year of EDFL female football. The growth in junior girls and senior women's football has been significant and continues to get bigger.

Growth

The number of females participating in the EDFL has increased by more than 40 per cent, which is outstanding and testament to the interest and desire of girls wanting to play football. In 2018, there was one division of senior women's football comprising of 505 females and 13 teams. In 2019 the competition grew to 20 teams and 717 footballers.

The EDFL junior girls competition continued its amazing growth, increasing again from the already impressive 65 teams in 2018. This season we saw 70 female-only teams compete in the EDFL, which reflects what a great time it is for female football.

Junior Girls

The junior girls competition demonstrated an increase of the skill level throughout all age groups and divisions. The girls' passion for the game is extraordinary and all of our clubs should be proud of their efforts and commitment. The clubs' support and encouragement of these young girls was a major contributing factor to the competition's success. The girls were welcomed and made to feel part of the club and if this was not the attitude, we would not be seeing the success and passion we are. The girls now are aspiring to follow in the same footsteps as the boys have for many years, progressing from Auskick, to under-

age junior football, then representing the EDFL at interleague level, which was again a fantastic display of skill and teamwork. This year saw another history making moment for girls in interleague, as it was the first year the EDFL was able to field two sides in the competition, and both were very competitive. These platforms mean the dream of playing AFLW is within their grasp.

Senior Women

The second season of EDFL Women's saw the inclusion of six new teams, a previously combined team separating to field individual teams and one club managing to field two EDFL Women's teams, which was a fantastic effort by all involved. All teams should be commended on a fantastic season, both new and previously established.

Finals Series

As in previous seasons, the weather was not too kind for the junior girls or women's grand finals. Despite that, all teams soldiered on and provided a great display of female football. The skill improvement in female football over the last few years has been tremendous and anyone who has followed the development of talent in the EDFL girls and women's competitions will agree that it shows come the finals series each year. Congratulations to all successful teams for the 2019 season.

Moving Forward

Season 2020 looks even more interesting and as the teams and clubs become more established, the skills will continue to



improve and even more girls will start to play football.

The season couldn't have been as successful as it was without the tremendous support of the clubs and the EDFL supporting female football. The EDFL media department gave female football significant coverage, the umpiring staff and the EDFL football operations staff managed where possible to fixture the women's games so they could share the spotlight and occasionally play night games as well.

Bring on Season 2020.



AFL Victoria Development Report

HE 2019 season has again been a success, with innovation, development and progression thriving in the north west region of Melbourne. Whilst not without change, Mark Morgan has moved into a new role within the AFL after his four-anda-half years supporting the EDFL. We thank Mark for all his efforts in his tenure in the role and look forward to working alongside him in future Auskick and junior transition initiatives. Nish Moses replaced Mark as the new Football Development Manager for the north west region mid-October. We look forward to Nish's contribution and impact moving into Season 2020. It's also important to acknowledge Samuel Malual, who was terrific in contributing to and managing the north west region between Mark moving on and Nish returning from duties at the AFL. All the best with your future endeavours, Sammy, and we look forward to working with you down the track.

Schools

This year has seen us again put a heavy focus on ensuring that our game has a very strong presence in as many local schools as possible. Our relationship with schools has continued to improve, and ultimately allowed us to run programs throughout the region involving interactions with over 20,000 students. The flagship of this suite of offers to schools remains the Australian Sports Commission's 'Sporting Schools Program', but also includes Auskick Assembly Promotions, Footy Frenzy

Days, AFL 9's and One-off clinics, AFL player appearances and Multicultural School Programs.

Multicultural Engagement

The north west region of Melbourne was boosted in 2019 with the introduction of Muhammad Saad, a Bachar Houli trainee, whose focus was to assist and progress football within diverse communities. Muhammad has had a great impact within school communities, building strong positive relationships and engaging children that haven't been involved in football before. Thank you for your efforts, Saady! The Essendon Football Club were brilliant in 2019, with their engagement and access to their NGA programs and assistance with our Multicultural School Programs.

District Scheme

A focus was to provide a wide education forum to assist volunteers upskill themselves for the benefit of themselves and their clubs, and the EDFL/WRFL Development Seminar at Victoria University was held again. The development seminar was a huge success with 12 sessions being held and 70 volunteers attending on the day.

Club Improvement Program

We have continued to work with clubs to complete the Club Improvement Program, but the uptake remains low within our region. This program is a fantastic tool designed

to assist in all facets of your club and we implore committees to go through the process in 2020.

Coaching

Coaches play the most critical role in the experience many of us have, and clubs that are proactive in establishing positive environments are having success in the recruitment and retention of players, setting themselves up for sustained success. Coach.AFL had considerable improvements as the online database that ensures all accredited coaches have access to drills and modules to assist with their upskilling and development at any time. The system also ensures that coaches can easily accredit and re-accredit without attending mandatory face-to-face sessions, allowing easier accessibility to get involved and numerous extra opportunities provided by us to learn more if time permits.

The Calder Coaching Academy was the highlight for coaching in the region, with 30 experienced coaches participating in seven sessions over seven months consisting of Essendon AFL, Essendon VFL, Essendon VFLW, Coburg VFL, Calder Cannons and alternate sporting facilitators. The program was resoundingly attended, with lots of positive feedback and amazing outcomes. The program will again run in 2020, with applications set to open in late November. The coaching coordinator position has continued to have a lower than encouraged uptake by EDFL clubs, which we again depict the importance in coach development and player retention that comes as a benefit to this role being filled. In summary, the coaching coordinator position establishes the learning and development environment for both the coaches and players while providing a consistency in coaching throughout the whole club.

Auskick

Auskick once again saw 3000 kids participate between the two regions, with Auskick coordinators and helpers putting together a massive effort every week to keep them running. Well done to those volunteers for their effort.

Appreciation

Congratulations to everyone for the year and thank you for your support. We hope it was one filled with great memories and has left you with a strong appetite to remain involved in 2020. We hope you enjoy your summer and enjoy the well-earned break.

Grand Final Review

RAIGIEBURN claimed its second Division 1 premiership in four seasons with an impressive 37-point win over East Keilor.

The Eagles led the game from start to finish in perfect Windy Hill conditions, kicking eight goals to three through the middle two quarters to set up the win.

Retiring midfielder Josh Young got the ball rolling with the first goal of the game at the two-minute mark, before Con Grampsas was able to respond seven minutes later.

John Bellino was the leading goal kicker on the ground with four majors while Vilinskis and Steve Boyall finished with two each.

The David McWilliam Medal went to big man Billy Morrison, who was outstanding both in ruck and around the ground with his strong contested marking.

It was Morrison's second best-on gong in an EDFL grand final, after claiming the official honours in Jacana's 2017 Division 2 Grand Final triumph over Coburg Districts.

For East Keilor, McCormack was the

only multiple goal kicker with two, while star youngster Ben Caluzzi was rated the Cougars' best by the *EDFL Match of the Day* call team.
Craigieburn will again be part of Strathmore Community Bank Premier Division in 2020 after last competing in the EDFL's top flight in 2017.
The Eagles will be hoping for a better result than what they produced in 2017, ending the year with a winless 0-18 record.

Grand Final Review
