Through the hard work of John Elliot (Strathmore) and John Larkins (Aberfeldie) the match of the day was held on the Queen's Birthday Weekend at Windy Hill as a fundraiser for the Pat Cronin Foundation.

The game attracted a significant crowd and the function organised by Strathmore was well attended. In total \$5000 was donated to the foundation thanks to the efforts of Strathmore, Aberfeldie and a generous donation from the East Sunbury Football Club.

Despite the impact of the lost season of 2020 and the shortened season 2021 on retention of volunteers and officials, the season was an overall success and numbers of teams competing in season 2022 were only marginally down in this season. The numbers are as follows:

Junior Mixed Teams: 188

Junior Boys Teams: 40

The numbers of teams competing in the competition was down and is an area

that has been identified as needing more targeted support and resources. A huge thanks to all the Clubs, officials and volunteers for their work in this season and also my thanks to our management team for all their hard work during the year and the finals series.

EDFL Finances

We have had a sound year and recorded a surplus of approximately \$220,000, which is an outstanding result.

Our Treasurer will give a more detailed explanation of the factors that has influenced the end of year result. While there are a few Clubs on payment plans, it is a continuing credit to all our Clubs who adopt a financially responsible approach to meet their commitments to the League. The Board thanks all our Clubs for honouring those important commitments.

Thanks to the work of Greta May and our Treasurer Andrea Tacono and to the support provided by our Finance Sub Committee.

EDFL Partners

A special thanks to all our corporate partners and sponsors for their continued support and in particular to the large number of new sponsors that came on board this year.

A special thanks to our major sponsor Strathmore Community Bank, its Chairman Peter Brown, the Board and its staff for its continued support and confidence it continues to show in our League and our ability to promote the Bank and the services it offers to the broader community.

EDFL Umpiring

In season 2022, the AFL industry, in particular metropolitan and country leagues, faced a decline in umpiring numbers which presented our umpiring department with an ongoing challenge. Our umpiring department led by Michael Willcox and Patrick Moloney, worked with our Senior Coach Brett Pallini and others, tirelessly and constructively to ensure, as far as practicable, that there was the maximum cover of umpires in the difficult circumstances that they faced during the season.

Thanks to all concerned for their work involvement in our vitally important umpire academies.

Future Developments

The League continues to work with strategic players on the future of Windy Hill and remains positive that there is a long term future for Windy Hill as a major football hub in the North-West and that community football and the EDFL will be a



vital part of that future.

Acknowledgement of Service

Our Clubs survive and prosper on the hard work of many but there are people who are examples of leadership that I personally would like to acknowledge, namely Allan Chandler and David Gloury. Allan has been a quiet and impressive leader of the Coburg Districts Football Club for 34 years as President, one year as Vice President and three years as Secretary. One can judge how impressive his leadership has been when one realises that when the Club entered the EDFL in 2013, it had three teams and this season it entered 13 teams including its first Under 18.5s team. That is no fluke but the result of a maintained focus on a plan and its implementation. Well done Allan - who will Co-President in his transition year. David had an involvement with the West Coburg Football Club as a premierships player and Senior Coach. He was also involved with the juniors and was Club President from 2005 to 2007 and 2012 to 2022. He has shown a lifetime of commitment to West Coburg and in stepping down from the role of Club President he will now focus on the re-development of Shore Reserve. David is passionately committed to his Club and remains a vital cog in fulfilling its ambitions for the future.

Senior Operations Report



It had been three very long years since we last saw Windy Hill packed full of people taking in the best exhibition of community football on offer anywhere around the country.

The EDFL's first senior finals series since 2019 was by far the most dramatic, suspenseful, and entertaining since I first became involved with the League nearly a decade ago, with big upsets, close finishes, massive crowds and most importantly, an overwhelming sense of positivity and community spirit. We were finally back, and it was wonderful to see so many people basking in the glory of our grand return.

It was testament to a season the EDFL community should be extremely proud of, having successfully executed our first complete season since the beginning of the pandemic.

Among the 30 total clubs who participated across our 14 senior football competitions in 2022 were a countless number of dedicated and passionate participants and volunteers whose efforts on and off the field must be acknowledged.

Without the many hundreds of people out in clubland putting in an enormous amount of hours toward their passion for football, we have no competition. Our competition has grown significantly in recent years, which has only increased the burden placed on Club Volunteers, and that is something always front of mind. We thank all of you for your contributions to the EDFL in 2022.

Senior Football

August 20 was a landmark day for our League, with three senior women's grand finals taking centre stage at Windy Hill for the first time. It began with Tullamarine completing a perfect season by holding on for a thrilling five-point win over Airport West. In Division One, Strathmore pulled off an impressive upset win over Greenvale, while Keilor cemented its claim as the best-performed women's team in League history by securing back-to-back Premier Division flags with a win over Aberfeldie.

It was the Blues' third senior premierships since 2017. We entered 2022 with a record 23 open-aged women's teams across the three divisions and we hope to see that number continue to grow. Well done to everyone involved and a big thank you to Airport Toyota for again supporting the women's competition as naming rights sponsor. The 2022 senior men's season also delivered some wonderful storylines that will be remembered for some time. Keilor Park's rise from recess to Division

Two premiers in just four years was quite remarkable. The Devils now stand as one of the great modern day EDFL success stories and in 2022 they were the only Club to field four open-aged men's teams - an achievement that shouldn't be overlooked. We wish them luck in Division One next year.

Airport West was a deserving winner of the Division One premierships following an outstanding and near-flawless campaign. The Eagles are a proven powerhouse in the EDFL's second tier and we now look forward to their latest quest up in the top flight next year.

The final act of the 2022 season provided for the ultimate grandstand finish. Both Strathmore and Aberfeldie had already put everything on the line throughout an enthralling Premier Division decider, but as the siren sounded to end the fourth quarter, they weren't done yet. With scores level, we were treated to 10 more minutes of classic grand final football to decide a premier. Strathmore eventually emerged victorious for its first Grand Final victory since 2014. The commitment and professionalism displayed by all of the Club and League personnel during those chaotic last moments of our season made me extremely proud of exactly what the EDFL community is capable of.

It was one of the EDFL's finest hours and the ultimate example of why we all should be so very thankful for everything and everyone that went into making 2022 such an amazing success. We give our appreciation to Strathmore Community Bank and Rookie Me for their ongoing support as major naming rights sponsors for our men's competitions and we now look forward to an even bigger 2023 where we welcome the return of East Sunbury into Division Two.

Under 18.5 Football

While we were able to achieve some growth in Under 18.5 Men's and Women's numbers this year, there remains a huge body of work ahead of us to promote and nurture this vital component of our competition. Despite all of the difficulties that came with the pandemic, we have seen Under 18.5 Men's team entries grow from 16 in 2019 to 25 in 2022. Despite those encouraging numbers, we must remain committed to helping all of our Clubs establish a stable and sustainable Under 18.5 program going forward. Similarly, our Under 18.5 Women's competition saw some growth with eight teams taking part in the first completed season in the age group since becoming a Saturday competition aligned with the seniors.



Further growth is high on the League's agenda and with a very healthy number of Under 16 Girls teams taking the field at junior level this year, the future does look bright at Under 18.5 level. We thank AGA for their ongoing commitment as the official naming rights partner of all men's and women's Under 18.5 divisions in 2022.

Thirds Competition

The EDFL's Thirds competition continues to provide hundreds of open-aged footballers with an opportunity to participate in the game where they otherwise couldn't, and it therefore remains a vital element of our senior football program. This year we had 13 teams take part, culminating in a very successful grand final out at Highgate Reserve, where a very enthusiastic crowd watched Keilor defeat Hillside in the decider. Shearasun Brewing Company came on-board as the naming rights partner for the competition in 2022, and their passionate support for the Thirds was very much welcomed and appreciated by all.

Other Acknowledgements

We must thank everyone involved with the EDFL Tribunal and Appeals Panel for their ongoing efforts during the 2022 season. The late David McWilliam, who most recently served as Tribunal Secretary, will be greatly missed by all in the EDFL community and we are forever thankful for his contributions over many decades. My colleagues in Football Operations put in a power of work to get this season completed, and I very much appreciate the support provided by Pauline Leslie, Ken Waters and Patrick Moloney throughout the year.

The EDFL was also proud to see Charlotte Baskaran (Aberfeldie), Abbey McDonald (Aberfeldie, Sunbury Kangaroos & Sunbury Lions) and Tahlia Read (Maribyrnong Park) drafted into the AFLW system. A special mention also goes out to all our EDFL juniors who represented their state and respective NAB League teams throughout the 2022 season. We give our best wishes to those who have nominated for the upcoming AFL Draft in November.

Junior Interleague

We completed a fantastic Interleague program with matches held over the Queen's Birthday weekend. We staged matches for both girls and boys programs against the WRFL, NFNL, SMJFL and YJFL. We thank all players, parents and coaches involved; without you we simply cannot



run this series.

Club Development Report



2022 saw the AFL and AFL Victoria introduce the role of a Club Support Manager into Community Leagues. Tasked with offering assistance across several portfolios, the EDFL Club Support Manager commenced in March. Initially a club health check-in was conducted with follow up meetings. Being close to the start of the home and away games commencing, most clubs were well organised and keen to get the season started. Volunteers returning and facilities were the most common areas of concern in club land followed by coaching and finances. Clubs were regularly notified with information around grant writing, child safety, coach education, liquor licensing, volunteer support etc across the 2022 season.

EDFL Coaching Academy

A female coaching academy was established and offered to all female coaches in the EDFL. Presentations were conducted by Natalie Wood – Essendon AFLW Head Coach, Michael Stinear – Melbourne AFLW Head Coach & AFLW Coach of the Year, Dani Laidley - Former AFL Player & Coach and Robbie Campbell from the Rookie Me Academy. An AFL Match Day Analysis session and training and game day mentoring also added to the knowledge of all female coaches involved in the

program. Training sessions and coaching in-services were offered to Clubs to assist their coaches and the role of a junior coaching coordinator has been promoted. Through connections at AFL Victoria, the Level 2 coaching courses have been advertised across the EDFL; aiming to improve the standard of coaching. It has been pleasing to see almost 50 EDFL coaches already participating in the initial stages of the Level 2 coach education programs.

Junior Development

Rookie Me came on board as a sponsor of the EDFL and conducted a series of skill acquisition and mini game sessions during the school holidays with over 500 EDFL junior players attending. The Calder Cannons used the Rookie Me sessions for talent identification and players from the sessions were added to the Calder Cannons NAB League squads from these sessions. An Under 14 girls training block was organised and delivered. Invitations for the sessions were sent out to 96 players after a process of nominations from club coaches, umpires and EDFL recruiting staff with 88 players attending the skill acquisition and small games sessions. This training block will be the start of the 2023 Metro Junior Champs U15 Girls program with the next training sessions scheduled for the Easter school holidays.



The 2023 Metro Junior Champs will be a three-game series in late May and early June with the EDFL entering teams in U15 Boys, U15 Girls, U14 Boys and the newly created U14 Girls competitions. This offers a wonderful opportunity for players to challenge themselves against the best players from other leagues but also an opportunity for EDFL coaches, trainers and team managers to gain valuable knowledge by assisting at a representative level.

Media Report



2022 delivered the first full season of football in over three years and with finals football back on the agenda, the EDFL media team were chomping at the bit to present some of the best action the community sporting landscape has to offer.

Entering my second year as the EDFL's Media Manager, there were many areas of the EDFL media portfolio I was eager to continue to develop and grow throughout the season.

Online Content

With the online and digital market continuing to grow, it was no surprise that our social media platforms flourished with the EDFL community flocking to our channels to keep up to date with all the latest EDFL news.

Our main EDFL social media channels all grew with Instagram again proving to be our fastest growing platform with the League's follower count increasing by a further 16.95 per cent from 2021's promising rise.

Facebook (7.4 per cent increase) also continued its steady online presence while the League's Twitter following also increased despite the tumultuous year for the platform.

The EDFL Live App, powered by Team App, provided an invaluable resource again for EDFL Media in season 2022 giving EDFL fans a convenient and user-friendly platform to access live scores, ladders, fixtures, team lists and news on matchdays and throughout the week. The app received well over 450,000 hits from the EDFL community within the season from April to September with almost another 50,000 hits in what are traditionally considered the 'off months' throughout the year.

The platform saw 350 new members joining the app as the EDFL team continues to strive in engaging with the EDFL fanbase.

With many users accessing their news and information via the social media channels of the EDFL, website traffic plateaued from 2021 numbers, but still received in excess of two million hits throughout the year.

I'd like to thank Jordan Zoch and Steven Zois for their contributions this year in producing weekly content for our website and online channels with Tara Murray the backbone behind the exciting and ever expanding EDFL Women's product that we continue to promote.

Filming & Match of the Day Broadcast

The action on a weekend is why everyone who contributes to this League gets involved.

We were again lucky enough to capture footage from all 14 senior men's games each and every weekend.

The work that Andrew McLeish and the team at Sportscast Australia put together throughout the season is unmeasurable and drives a majority of the EDFL's most sought out content.

The footage captured each Saturday is not only an invaluable media tool but also critical to coaches, players, clubs, fans,

staff and the tribunal as all aspects of the league review what took place on the weekend and start preparing for the week ahead.

The highlight packages produced by Sportscast are some of the highest drivers of social media engagement on our online platforms with players and fans alike eager to see who will be nominated for the 'iFLY Melbourne Mark of the Week' and 'The Meadows Goal of the Week' each round.

Working with Sportscast on a weekend, Cluch TV, returned in season 2022 to assist in presenting the *Nena and Pasadena Match of the Day* each weekend.

Cluch TV once again provided a user-friendly and easily accessible way for EDFL fans to watch the Match of the Day broadcast live via their smartphone or PC.

Thanks to Cluch, 338,556 total minutes were consumed by over 14,000 viewers throughout the year to watch the live coverage of the Match of the Day broadcast, with viewership peaking on Strathmore Community Bank Premier Division Grand Final day as 3,575 viewers tuned in, in addition to the bumper crowd already at Windy Hill.

We were also delighted to see the uptake of women's filmed content, with a blockbuster festival of football at Windy Hill for Airport Toyota Women's Grand Final day attracting almost 1,800 views across the three games played.

And for those who couldn't watch live, EDFL fans could always reliably tune into 98.9 North West FM to hear the call.

Thank you to John Dosen and the North West FM team that got us to air every Saturday throughout the season, they are truly the heroes behind the scenes.

Travis Poznachowski led the commentary team this season, in his eighth year with the EDFL media team and was supported superbly by Steven Zois in a more prominent play-by-play role during his second season with the team.

We were grateful to welcome Todd Morris to the coverage as well who flourished from an early season special comments role, to calling play-by-play in a number of our senior men's and women's grand finals.

A big thank-you also goes out to Cole Harvey, Tara Murray, Jordan Zoch, Ian Robinson, Adem Saricaoglu, Darren Flanigan, Michael Willcox and Mick Comerford who all made cameo appearances on the broadcast throughout the year.

We also thank Nena and Pasadena once again for their support of the Match of the Day broadcast. From kitting out the broadcast team to providing one of local football's most sought out player of the match prize packs, the NXP team were a pleasure to work with.

The Match of the Day broadcast was also supported by iFLY Melbourne, Airport Toyota and Sherrin in season 2022.

Podcasts

The EDFL Tonight Podcast entered its seventh season in 2022 and kicked-off



with a bang at the EDFL season launch. Tara Murray and I were delighted to welcome Steven Zois as our third regular co-host this season, filling the big shoes left by Adem Saricaoglu.

It was a pleasure to catch up weekly with Tara and Steve to talk all things happening within the league while also welcoming on the occasional guest appearance to chat EDFL footy.

Our thanks goes out to the Airport West and Jacana Football Clubs for hosting the podcast when we weren't in the usual Windy Hill studio, as well as our guests who took the time to jump on the headset with us throughout the season.

We also thank the loyal listeners of the show, with the podcast falling just short of 10,000 hits across the 31-episode season.

The EDFL Post Game Show Podcast also received a strong listenership from those unable to tune in between 5:00-5:30pm on a Saturday evening thanks to 98.9 North West FM.

With over 5,550 hits across the season, we thank our senior coaches for the access and insight they give us each round, no matter the result.

In what was the second full year of the academy program seven field, eight boundary and four goal umpires got the opportunity to join the Calder Cannons academy. These umpires had the opportunity to umpire VFLW, NAB Girls and NAB Boys matches as well as undertaking both personal and umpiring development opportunities. There were six EDFL umpires at the V-Line Cup in August and also 12 EDFL umpires selected in the squad to umpire the V-Line Cup in September. Angus Drenen received the Ian Coates award as the best junior field umpire. Lachlan Bezzina was awarded the AFL Victoria Silver Whistle as The Most Promising Umpire in the Calder Cannons. Alex Turner was awarded the Umpire of the Year at the EDFL presentation night.

Other Acknowledgements

It was fantastic to finish the first full season in the role and I would like to acknowledge the support of the EDFL staff and board members. There has been



significant focus and support in recruiting umpires and also creating a more positive environment for umpires. The support of AFL Victoria has also been beneficial to umpire recruitment. 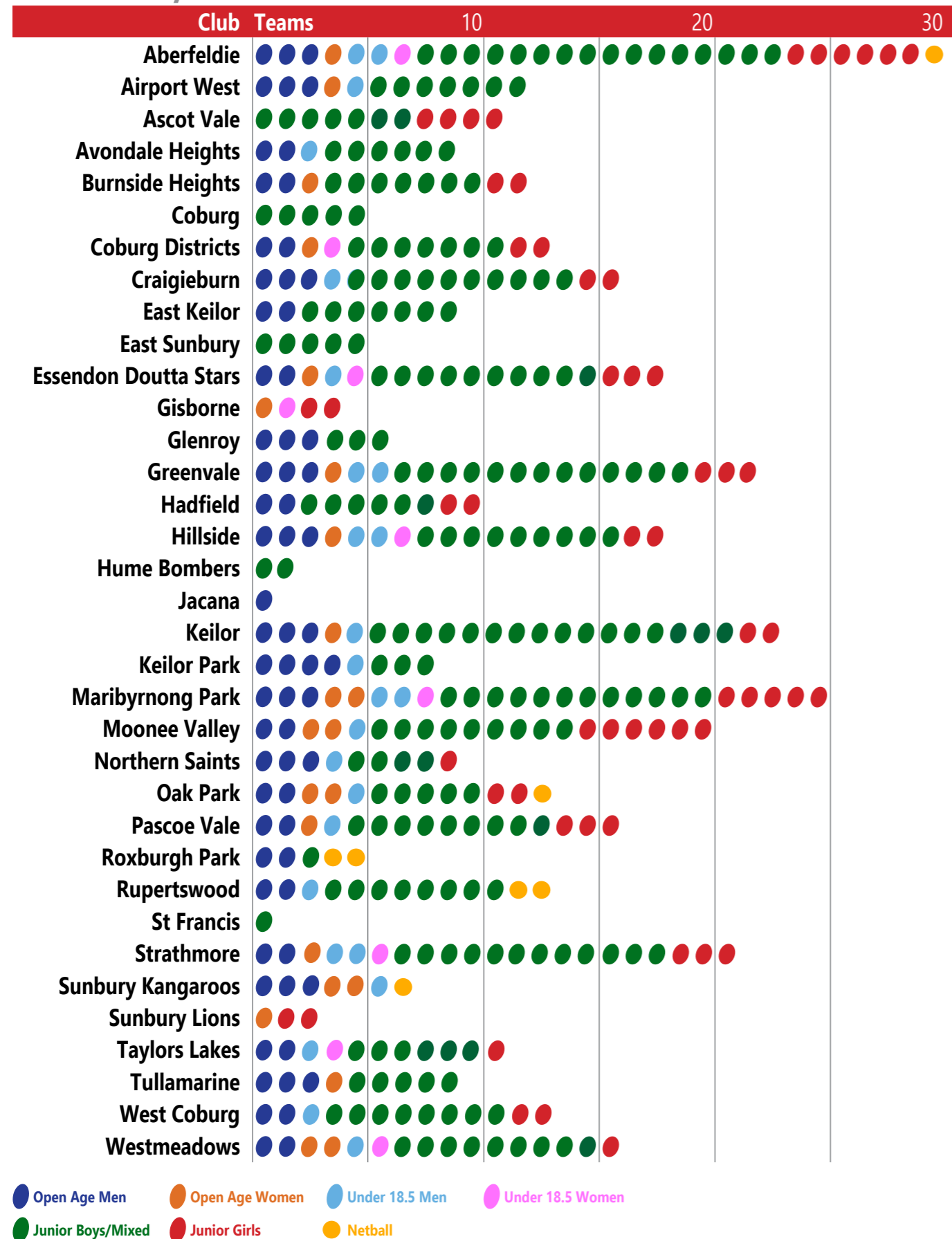

AFL Victoria Development Report



2022 saw a return to football across Victoria, it also saw the return of AFL Victoria led programs across the region. The AFL Victoria team introduced a new Participation Coordinator to the region in January, with Shannon Gore taking over for Shane Abdilla who is now at Essendon FC. Shannon came across from a six-month stint with the WRFL in the same role. AFL Victoria also welcomed Damon Guy to the role of Participation Officer, following the departure of both Sam and Alana in June.

The year kicked off with a few different initiatives across the region, with an all-girls Footy 4 Fun held out at Ascot Vale. Fifty girls came out to have some fun with over 29 then going on to register for Juniors or Auskick! Huge result for girls' participation within the region!

We also held come and try days at both Glenroy and Keilor Park with a further 19 participants going on to register for Juniors or Auskick in 2022.

Schools
As in previous years, we have put a heavy focus on ensuring that our game has a very strong presence in as many local schools as possible and 2022 was no exception. Our relationship with schools has continued to improve, which ultimately allowed us to run many programs throughout the region involving face to-face interactions with over 15,000 students across schools. Our offering of 'Primary Play' has proven to be very popular with many schools already taking up programs for Term 4 2022 and Term 1 2023. We want to continue to bring football to schools to ensure that children get the opportunity to experience the game. We'd also like to thank our Game Development Officers who were tremendous in helping to facilitate all of our sessions across multiple regions and are continuing to do so moving into the back end of the year.

Alongside schools this year we were able to hold our Community Camp with the Essendon Football Club. A combination of Auskick videos to selected participants and a few virtual Q & A sessions with classrooms proved to

be very popular for our schools. We are hoping for more interaction face-to-face with players in 2023 now that the situation with the pandemic is improving!

Auskick
Auskick in 2022 saw 2400 kids participate across the region, this is slightly down on 2021. Our Auskick coordinators and helpers put together a massive effort every week to ensure that the kids stayed engaged and that their sessions were fun! Well done to those volunteers for their effort.

Post Auskick season saw our traditional Auskick Transition Carnival return! We saw over 156 boys and 13 girls across 18 teams come out to Essendon Football Club – The Hangar to compete in U8 style rules wearing club jumpers. Having several Junior Clubs in attendance and providing those Club jumpers gave the kids the chance to experience what juniors would be like moving forward. This is a massive win as a region as we were able to bring Clubs and Auskick together to help support the next generation of footballers.

Alternate Formats
This year, we have introduced a number of new and exciting programs for the region. Auskick Plus, Junior X and Footy 4 Fun are our key programs heading into the back end of the year. Term 3 saw us deliver two Auskick Plus programs in Gladstone Park and Coolaroo with 46 and 122 registered respectively. We are excited to continue to grow participation in the Broadmeadows corridor and help support Schools, Auskick and Junior Clubs within that area.

We have had several Footy 4 Fun – Come and Try days across Hume and Merri-bek in the last few weeks. Starting in Craigieburn, we travelled on into Jacana and Sunbury to keep bringing football to the community. The aim of these come and try sessions is to introduce the game to participants who are new to the game and need help linking into an Auskick or Junior Club. We have had great turns out so far, and we expect to see a growth in the region in 2023.

Our final initiative that is being rolled out in 2022 is Junior X. This modified



version of the game sees Juniors aged 8-14 take part in a round robin five-week competition on rectangular grid style grounds 80m x 40m. This game has nine a side and only goes for 45 minutes. It has been very difficult given the recent rainfall in Melbourne and it has seen a delay to the start of the season. We are hopefully of fulfilling the five rounds before we hit the Christmas period. It has been a mountain of work behind the scenes, but we are determined to get this going. We have seen some great uptake this year, so we want to ensure we can deliver as much as we can.

Grand Final Review



Strathmore brought honour and glory back to Lebanon Reserve via the grand final for the first time since 2014, after defeating Aberfeldie in extra time of the Strathmore Community Bank Premier Division Grand Final, 11.11-77 to 8.13-61 in front of an unbelievably strong crowd at Windy Hill.

Daniel Mammoliti slotted the first goal of the afternoon to send the Mores supporters into hysterics but the Two Blues jumped out of the blocks after that, and made the most of the advantageous wind towards the primary school end of the ground.

It was a long and entertaining first term which saw seven goals kicked collectively, with Abers leading the contest by nine points.

Strathmore would return fire in the second term and score identically to that of what Abers mustered, adding four goals and three behinds to their second term score to take a 16-point lead into the main break.

Aberfeldie's three goals and four behinds for the quarter gave them just a five-point lead going into the final break, setting up a grandstand finish to what was already a hotly contested grand final.

The first 10 minutes of the quarter were dominated by Adam Marcon's men. They were able to restrict Strathmore of any possession with the footy and this was capped off by a brilliant goal from a stoppage by Michael Ktona, who extended the lead to 13 points.

The game was hot, and it was physical but little did we know that it was just about to heat up to yet another level.

Andrew Gallucci would be the first player to breathe life back into the game for the Mores, slotting a huge goal from 45 metres out directly in front, bringing the margin back to just one straight kick in the process. He was then followed by the clutch master in

Mitch Purcell, who steadied to level the scores from almost the same position with 26 minutes gone on the clock, sending the Strathmore crowd into absolute hysterics.

With the scores level at 60 apiece it set up a mammoth final couple of minutes. Strathmore went forward again a couple of times and tried to salvage a score to put them in front.

A huge grab from Tom Denning saw him take a set shot right on the point of 50, with the kick coming off the side of the boot and going out of bounds in the right forward pocket for Strathmore.

With the ball in neutral territory for the last minute, Strathmore would attempt one last attack inside 50, with the ball ending up in front of the hill as the siren sensationally sounded with the scores still level.

It meant we were going to extra time.

the faithful of the navy blue and gold coming together in one voice as the siren sounded. Ecstasy for Strathmore, agony for Aberfeldie.

Mammoliti, Purcell, Kyle Weightman and Brock Egglestone would all manage two goals on the afternoon for Strathmore, and were followed by Athan Tsialtas, Tom Denning and Andrew Gallucci who added singles.

For the Two Blues Joey Dimasi, Michael Ktona and Lucas Rocci all added two goals each, with Zach Hislop and Tye Browning adding singles also.

And it was none other than Adam Iacobucci who picked up the Reg Rose Medal with best on ground honours for a stellar performance throughout the contest for his consistency around the footy. A well deserved feat for one of the League's most experienced men.

It's a match that will be talked about for years on end, and rightfully so. What a game, what a contest, what unbelievable atmosphere. That's EDFL footy.

Keilor Park's story of from rags to riches is complete with the Devils claiming the Strathmore Community Bank Division Two premiership.

Grand Final Review



The legacy of Keilor's women's program continues to grow with the club claiming the Airport Toyota Women's Premier Division premiership.

Having either won a premiership or been in a grand final every year since forming a women's side, the Blues were keen to add to that against Aberfeldie.

The Keilor back line set up much of the Blues attacks, with Abers having only a couple of good shots on goal for the match.

Surgeon said they had really worked on that in the back part of the season.

"It was definitely was a huge focus for us, no easy marks, no easy possessions," she said.

"We spent a lot of time improving our scoring throughout the season, the last couple of weeks was really focusing on our defence and locking down their opponents and not letting them get any easy position."

Leading by 18 points at half time the Blues were able to continue to steady the ship with another goal.

They moved a number of players around in the last quarter, as cramping and the heavy ground took its toll.

Surgeon also made sure every player got time on the ground and got to enjoy the moment.

"We had to keep changing some things around as Aberfeldie were tagging some of our players and it was about trying to bring them into the game," she said.

"It's also developing players. While it's a grand final, we're still looking to the future and 2023 and trying

to get them experience through the midfield.

"Steph [Aleksovski] in the midfield pretty much played the whole game having never played midfield before.

"We knew they were going to be looking for Caruso and Liv [Manfre] and everyone like that she's just a competitor."

Sabine Navarro, who was awarded the best-on-ground medal, got a goal in the dying seconds to cap off the win.

Surgeon said Navarro was playing in her last game, having decided to retire.

The premiership in the Blues' third women's premiership.

Surgeon said it's pretty special for the club and making sure they leave a mark in female football.

"It's been around for the last few years and it's been a focus," he said. "It's kind of like Geelong and we keep trying to get better.

"Every year we build on different things. We started at the bottom and kept adding building blocks to be so competitive every season."

The Eagles kicked the first goal of the second half to hit the front, a situation the Demons had not been in all season.

The Demons could have easily just fell away, but it saw them go to another level. They kicked the next one and led by five points.

Nothing would split the two teams in the last quarter. Both teams had two shots on goal, but neither team could find another one, with the Demons winning, 3.5-23 to 2.6-18.

Emily Angelidis was named best-on-ground for her efforts in defence, including helping keep the division's leading goal kicker Emily Gipp goalless.

The premiership is a result of how far the Demons have come in a short period of time.

Demons coach and president, Peter Labbad admits he wasn't keen on the whole idea of having a women's side at the start.

"For me to coach the girls is very

ironic," he said. "I didn't want any girls at the Tullamarine footy club.

"Now I've coached them and it's been three years of hard work. It's the best thing the club has had for a long while.

"It's changed our dynamic and atmosphere and the men and women just get around each other.

"More than 90 per cent of the senior men were here today. It just shows our culture we've been trying to change over the last five years has changed."

Labbad said the match was never going to be a high scoring effort. He said in the end it was a toss of the coin.

"We did say it was going to be ugly and the rain made it harder and it stopped our run," he said.

"It brought them back into it and it was exactly what [Airport West coach] Marcus [Barclay] was saying.

"It was grit for both sides. You could flip a coin at the end of a day and I'm so proud of them."

After the second quarter where they struggled to get the ball forward, Labbad made some key positional changes.

Courtney Annett, who was controlling the ruck, was moved forward. Co-captain Tricia Devine, who was quiet up forward, went into the middle.

"I had to make them," Labbad said. "Courtney took four big marks in the second half.

"Trik started to get the ball out of the middle, where she had been shut down in the half forward line where she was dominating all

season.

"It's good to have that versatility. It was all about fitness and that fitness gives me the opportunity to change it over."

Both of those two players could have easily been best on ground. Labbad also spoke highly of Angelidis for her best-on-ground performance.

"Emily had never played back line and we had an argument at the start of the year about her playing at full back," he said.

"I saw her run and her one-on-one work and this year it changed our whole dynamic. She's used to running in the middle and she was amazing

"She was an amazing assistant coach."

As well as being happy for the girls, Labbad said on a personal level the win was pretty special.

"I've had 49 years in footy and for me and I'd never won a flag and never played in a grand final," he said. "I had coached four losing grand finals too."
