Chairman's Report



I am proud to say that this year's Essendon District Football League was one of the most enjoyable on record.

And what made it enjoyable was not just the spectacle for the families and fans looking on, but the major increase in competitive balance for all our playing participants.

Three close, competitive divisions of senior football and the junior re-grading process created one of the most engaging seasons for our footballers ever.

The benefits of the big decision to split the old B-grade in 2012 were borne out this year as three close premiership races and two close relegation battles took place in our senior grades.

The effect of junior re-grading was more immediate, and I cannot wait to measure the long-term benefits that will come from making junior football a more enjoyable experience for its participants.

I acknowledge that junior re-grading was not popular with everyone, but the statistics such as 26 of 27 clubs making finals and 22 clubs a junior grand final speaks for itself.

I want to thank all the EDFL sponsors for another year of commercial confidence in local footy. In particular Strathmore Community Bank as the major sponsor of the Premier Division, and our other leading partners Essendon Ford, Just Cuts and Apprenticeships Group Australia. For the first time in the history of the EDFL every club was financial. What is disappointing is that clubs in spite of



achieving this financial position have not addressed the issue of skyrocketing player payments, sign-on fees and enducements.

Clubs are working harder than ever to raise money, sponsorship and revenue but have had to do so in order to meet players' increasing demands. Clubs are still spending beyond what is sustainable in the long term on their playing list.

With that said, our clubs have never been in better shape as they present themselves to the community as family-friendly, female-friendly destinations for leisure and social activity.

The EDFL returned to the field in senior interleague this year but not with a performance that reflects where our competition stands in the grand scheme of local football.

The clubs did not embrace senior interleague to the extent required to compete and this was reflected in both our performance and result.

The EDFL board has not accepted the performance produced in 2014 and will be making changes for 2015.

The relocation of league headquarters to Windy Hill is closer than ever and will give us a home base that gives us a significant footprint in the heart of EDFL territory.

We welcomed our first female board member Tanya Taylor in 2014, making the step up after a long service at Marib-



yrnong Park to be a valuable contributor to the board. Ken Waters' retirement was short lived and we welcome him back to a restructured football administration for 2015. We were fortunate enough to welcome Rowan Sawers, an AFL life member and former AFL umpires coach, as the EDFL umpires coach. The EDFL has now secured Rowan's services full time in 2015. It was also fitting that such a memorable season be documented and covered far more extensively than in years past, thanks to the addition of Teo Pellizzeri as the league's media officer.

In any football community we have unsung heroes that go beyond the call of normal service and duties. These people should be recognised, and I was proud to oversee the creation and implementation of the Rose-Price Award for services to football this year.

It was only fitting that the award be named after past presidents in Reg Rose OAM and Ian Price who have devoted two lifetimes' work to the game.

Anyone who knows Des Menzies, the inaugural recipient, through his involvement in the competition will know that the Rose-Price Award will be one of the most revered the EDFL or any competition can give.

Thank you to the EDFL Board Members and administrator for their support and efforts through 2014. I also thank all presidents, committees and volunteers for the time and effort you have put into building a stronger EDFL.

General Manager's Report

The 2014 season is one that saw a number of changes within the EDFL competition and in many respects required the patience of our member clubs as these new initiatives were implemented. These included Junior Grading, Apparel Licensing and Senior Interleague.

The EDFL Board and Management also witnessed change in 2014.

Matthew Pillios did not seek re-election at the end of the 2013 season with Tanya Taylor joining the Board of Management in Matthew's place. Tanya has a lifetime of football administration experience at Maribymong Park at both junior level and senior level. Tanya's football skills and knowledge, together with her professional attributes in man-management has proven to be a valuable addition to the EDFL Board of Management.

At management level the position of Media Officer was increased to a full-time level with Teo Pellizzeri immediately increasing the level of professionalism and quality of presentation through radio, print and social media outlets. The viewership levels of the high quality videos, the website traffic and an increase in interaction on Twitter and Facebook has been notable since Teo's appointment. Having a Full-Time Media officer within the EDFL's management structure ensures that players and supporters are more fully informed of change and good news stories that exists at club level.

The structure of the Umpires Department was also made more professional with the addition of AFL Hall of Fame member Rowan Sawers to the position of Director of Umpiring. Rowan came to the EDFL after 16 years coaching Australia's best umpires at the elite level. The level of respect that Rowan holds amongst the umpires and the clubs is immediately recognisable and it is a credit to the EDFL to be able to attract and retain a person of Rowan's quality. Immediately upon Rowan's appointment umpiring numbers increased, as did the level of professionalism, fitness and commitment from the EDFL umpires.

SENIOR FOOTBALL

Congratulations to all clubs who achieved premier-success in season 2014.

Strathmore continues to excite, winning the Strathmore Community Bank Premier Division flag by two points over local rival Aberfeldie. For Strathmore, this was their third Grand Final in four years, winning their second premiership in that time. Amazingly, each of the three grand finals has finished with a two (2) point margin.

West Coburg achieved its stated aim of a return to Premier Division Football with a strong victory in the Essendon Ford Division 1 Grand Final. West Coburg are no stranger to the top tier of EDFL football and with a coach the quality of Digby Morrell at the helm, who has won premierships at both Premier Division and Division 1 level, the club will be well equipped to handle the step-up in 2015.

In Division 2, East Keilor was too strong in the Grand Final for a much improved Roxburgh Park. With home grown junior players key figures in the team, the Cougars were strong throughout the season finishing in second position and were the dominant team throughout the finals campaign. Winning their second premiership in three years, East Keilor will be delighted to earn promotion to Division 1. The 2014 season saw the debut to senior football for Burnside Heights. Winning two games and avoiding the wooden spoon in its inaugural season was a credit to everyone involved at the club. The most pleasing aspect of the season was the competitiveness of all three senior divisions. The

league as a whole proved to be one of the most even in Victoria.

The Premier Division proved to be the most competitive with the average winning margin decreasing by nearly two goals per game from 2013. The highly competitive Division 1 competition's average winning margin decreased by 8 points per game. Whilst the biggest decrease in average winning margin came from the Division 2 competition with a decrease of over 3 goals per game in the average winning margin.

JUNIOR FOOTBALL

A new grading system was introduced in 2014 to address the high junior margins that had become evident in junior football.

The team oriented grading system, with a mid-year regrading mechanism was designed to ensure teams were placed in divisions where they would be competitive on a weekly basis.

The improvement was immediate with all age groups and all divisions achieving competitive fixtures and reduced margins. The final average margins with comparable to the best recorded in metropolitan Melbourne.

FINANCIAL

A strong finals series resulted lead to a strong financial result for the 2013/14 financial year.

An increase in finals income of 39% and an increase in sponsorship income by 51% was largely responsible for the EDFL recording a profit of \$74,090. It is pleasing to note the leagues ability to absorb an increase in staffing levels - designed to support the clubs - without forcing a cost increase on clubs.

STRATEGIC GROWTH

The EDFL Board and Management continue to work closely with AFL Victoria to ensure strategic growth of the EDFL competition.

The growth LGA's of Melton and Hume remain of strong interest to the EDFL and liaison with these councils ensures that the EDFL is well placed to take advantage of any growth within these areas. Growth is not simply limited to these two recognised growth suburbs, as the inner suburbs of North-West Melbourne also continue to increase in population.

SPONSORSHIP AND MARKETING

The EDFL commenced the season with the exciting announcement that the Strathmore Community Bank had agreed to a corporate partnership with the EDFL. This partnership is the biggest in the history of the EDFL and I must extend my appreciation to Strathmore Community Bank President Peter McKie, Secretary Peter Brown and the board and staff at the Strathmore Community Bank. This corporate support from the Strathmore Community Bank has allowed the EDFL to increase its professionalism and support to the clubs with the

addition of the full-time positions of Media Officer and Director of Umpiring whilst absorbing all costs internally.

The Strathmore Community Bank's support of the EDFL is not simply limited to the league, with the bank also strong in its support of a number of EDFL Clubs and Channel 31's Local Footy Show. Their support of local football is second-to-none.

The EDFL continued to receive strong support from a number of other sponsors, with Essendon Ford the naming rights sponsor of the Division 1 competition, whilst Apprenticeships Group Australia acquired the naming rights of the EDFL's Under 18.5 competitions.

What were the positives for your club in 2014?

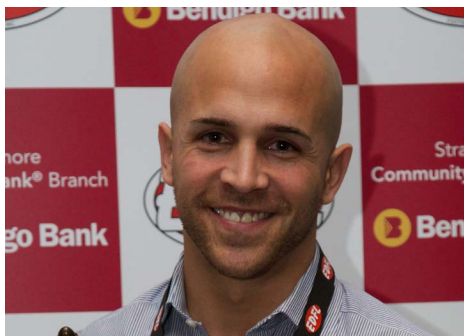

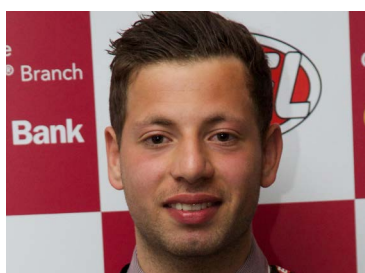

Media Officer Report

The upgrade of the media officer's role to a full-time position is one that the EDFL had been eager to institute for a number of years, culminating in my hiring in January 2014.

Having covered the EDFL since 2010 in both print and on radio, I welcomed the opportunity to leave print media and come to the thriving business of local footy.

The position of media officer had some broad guidelines and expectations, and 2014 has largely been a process of working out what works and what is impractical.

There is no doubt that everything comes back to time. After a season of pushing the boundaries, I have a far better grasp of what can be turned around within the space of a week during the season.

Some of the league's noteworthy achievements include:

- A slicker, better packaged Web TV show with 99 videos and more than 25 hours of original content uploaded to the EDFL YouTube Channel over the course of the season
- A total viewcount for web TV of over 35,000, an increase of total views of 79% on 2013, with minutes watched up 70% and peak audience up 65%
- A steady increase in social media following across Facebook, Instagram & Twitter
- A huge increase in league-produced content, both informing the league's followers but also providing pre-written material to local media outlets
- An increased match-day radio show by 90 minutes, with an hour-long pre-game and extra 30-minutes of post-game, allowing greater diversity of coverage across the entire competition on match-day (ie phone guests and updates from the games not designated as match of the day)
- The introduction of Team App as the league's official smart-phone app
- Specialised promotion of umpiring, junior football and interleague to drive participation
- A composed handling of the incidents that attracted adverse mainstream media publicity for the league

I would like to acknowledge the contribution of volunteers to the media team across the league. Adem Saricaoglu and Dave Kennedy as play-by-play callers, Tony Lasko as our boundary rider, Tamara Rocco as boundary rider and pre-game show producer, Adrian Jamieson, Adam Papal, Matt O'Connor and Ben Chapman for their work as on-air contributors. Also Luke Mortimer who reported on games for the EDFL website and The Footballer.

I would also like to thank Jean Rau and the rest of the North West FM board, and our panel operator John Dosen, for continuing the strong relationship between the EDFL and North West FM. It is my sincere hope that the National Commission of Audit (May 1, 2014) recommendation of the abolition of community broadcasting does not become a reality. However the EDFL does have a ready-to-go contingency plan to continue broadcasting match of the day both online and on smart phones should the worst happen.

Some key areas of focus for the immediate future include the identification of opportunities to commercialise EDFL media products through sponsorship, and retention and recruitment of media team volunteers.

A long term goal will be to make the media officer's position sustainable beyond my own personal employment. While I took great pride in working the long hours and consecutive days in-season, it is important to remember that the role of media officer needs to be a position with a workload and skill-set that can be realistically outlined on a job description, for when the time comes that it needs to be filled. Which I do hope is not for some time yet.

Community Relations *Report*

This year, over 319 teams participated in EDFL footy, providing opportunities for over 8000 people to enjoy the vast benefits of playing football. Add to this over 400 umpires, over 350 coaches, numerous match day volunteers, parents and spectators and the EDFL's contribution to caring for the game and providing for the community is substantial. Everyone involved in making this happen should be extremely proud.

A lot seemed to happen this year. Changes to the junior grading policy, the introduction of Under 8s and changes within the EDFL umpiring and media departments are just a few reflection points that confronted the League and Clubs before a ball had been bounced in 2014. I believe a fair reflection of this change would be to say that the EDFL got many things right, a few things wrong and will take many lessons learned into 2015. Most importantly, we should consider that while the League and Clubs at times hold differing views and engage in heated debate, the willingness to work together in the best interests of the League substantially contributes to making the EDFL a great competition.



A good example can be highlighted from AFL Victoria's announcement that they would be undertaking a review of football in Melbourne's North West. Whilst the announcement of such work was not new to clubs, the release of its findings generated levels of ambiguity leading into the 2014 season. Rumours spread like wildfire with clubs pondering mergers with the WRFL and imposed commissions and boundaries among other innuendo. The League and clubs again showed a resolve to stand together to ensure any changes to the game within our borders have the best interests of the EDFL and its clubs at its forefront.

The document which was released by AFL Victoria: Western and North Western Future Directions Report largely made reference to the need for a "whole of game strategic development plan" to address current issues and capitalise on future opportunities which confront clubs in the region. Many may agree with such a plan in theory but also ponder what this means for local Clubs and Leagues.

Consider that the Football Industry has wisely devoted its attention to what its operatives often refer to in technical terms as junior development and talent, which in the case of Victoria has seen Auskick and the TAC Cup Competition emerge as the trademark programs respectively; within each of these departments of Football. Both programs have had a tremendous impact on the game and have strengthened clubs in many ways. But has the emergence of these programs, inadvertently placed an unworkable load for local clubs to burden?

I will use the English Channel: the notable stretch of water which divides the south of England from the north of France as an analogy to elaborate on the question above. If the pastures of Southern England are representative of the TAC Cup and other talent initiatives,

whilst Northern France encapsulates the effort which goes into recruiting and retaining Auskick participants each year, the stretch of ocean which makes up the English Channel is a fair representation of the gap within the current participation pathway.

Because of the benefits previously referred to, in addition to the potential and sometimes real opportunities that await the other side of the Sea, local clubs have showed a willingness to equip their vessels so as they can transport their kids across this European Landmark, or in real terms, ensure that their kids have the best opportunity to transition from Auskick through to the TAC Cup. The work that this takes cannot be underestimated and is represented by the number of clubs whose vessels have endured great damage whilst attempting to do so. Match this with the ever increasing club governance responsibilities, the need to fundraise, issues in recruiting volunteers, dealing with the rigors of player payments and increased responsibilities from Leagues, Governing Bodies and Local Government and the answer as to why so many clubs no longer exist becomes clearer.

So how do we, the Football Industry, use our recent history as a learning opportunity to create a strategy for the future? I believe a greater depth of consultation with local clubs needs to drive this, along with the willingness for clubs to give honest accounts of their club operations and the challenges they face. A coordinated strategy must then follow, which does not simply demand more from clubs but provides actual solutions to repair damages, confront challenges and provide the resources required to effectively capitalise on future opportunities.

EDFL clubs have done more than their fair share of "taking good care of our game" for a very long time and I am forever fortunate of the opportunity to work with such a committed group of people. I look forward to continuing to work with clubs in 2015 to assist you in achieving the aspirations that you hold for your clubs.



I believe that we can continue to work together to ensure that the EDFL competition keeps on thriving in an era where our growing yet ever changing population will present as many challenges as it will opportunities and the continuity of threat that other sports pose and an increased inclination toward dormant lifestyles continue to spread like toxins across our community.

First and foremost- I will do all I can to ensure that no EDFL club/s contribute to the number of sunken vessels at the bottom of the English Channel. Continuing to engage with Clubs to gain an understanding of the challenges you face and lobbying for a greater portion of the Industry's resources to come your way will be of equal importance.

Thanks for a great 2014 season.

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Vic) and the Associations Incorporation Reform Regulations 2012 (Vic). The committee has determined that the League is not a reporting entity.

The statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Vic) and the Associations Incorporation Reform Regulations 2012 (Vic) and the following Australian Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements.

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous periods unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

(a) Income Tax

The League is exempt from Income Tax pursuant to section 50-45 and section 50-1 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, on all income received.

(b) Fixed Assets

Freehold Land and Buildings are brought to account at cost or independent or committee member's valuation.

Office Equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(c) Revenue

Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the entity and the revenue can be reliably measured.

Interest revenue is recognised when it is actually received from the financial institutions.

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

(d) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits to be settled within one (1) year together with benefits arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and such leave which will be settled after one (1) year, have been measured at their nominal amount. Other employee benefits payable later than one (1) year have been measured at present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

Contributions are made by the association to an employee superannuation fund and are charged when the expense is occurred.

(e) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash on hand and in banks and short term deposits are stated at nominal value. For the purposes of the Cash Flow Statement, cash includes cash on hand and in banks and money market instruments, readily convertible to cash within two (2) working days, net of outstanding bank overdrafts.

(f) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

NOTE 2: RELATED PARTIES

During the year ended 31 October, 2014, there were no related party transactions entered into by the League with members of the Committee.

NOTE 3: CHANGE IN ACCOUNTING POLICY

There have been no changes made to the Accounting Policies adopted by the Committee for the financial year ended 31 October, 2014.

NOTE 4: SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

There are no subsequent events to these accounts that the League's committee is aware of that would have a material effect on them.

NOTE 5: FUTURE COMMITMENTS

The Committee continues to review proposals for the re-development of the League Headquarters at 14 Marshall Road, Airport West, and should a re-development proceed, it will have the potential to reduce the cash flow reserves, which in turn will reduce the income earning capacity of those reserves.






Qualification
