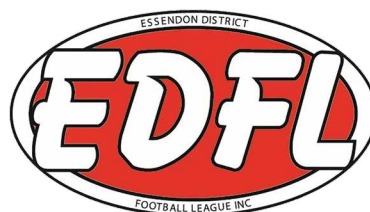

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT



The EDFL had another strong year in 2015, reflected in strong finances, strong playing numbers and a strong brand. With AFL Victoria introducing a statewide points system in 2016 and a statewide salary cap in 2017, it is important that the EDFL maintains a strong presence. We continue to stress that it is vitally important that clubs are financially responsible at all times. You, the clubs, have an amazing ability to raise vast amounts of money, however it is the direction it is spent that continues to concern the board. Over the coming years we have a lot to look forward to and embrace:

- The EDFL will depart Airport West for Windy Hill as of 2016
- We will sign off on a long-term sponsorship agreement with our major partner, Strathmore Community Bank
- Junior age groups will change from evens to odds from 2017
- Under 19s will be introduced from 2017
- Head office will undergo a major review and re-structure
- Player points system in 2016
- Salary cap in 2017

The two biggest changes ever in community football, the points system and salary cap, will impact all leagues, not just the EDFL. However we ask all clubs to take an active interest in the major issues that may impact the whole of the EDFL, not just their own club. For example, our preferred points system transition model was not approved by AFL Victoria and I fear our desired salary cap transition model will not be accepted, either.

In 2015 the EDFL, along with AFL Victoria co-invested in two football development managers in Mark Morgan and Chris Johnson. With the information Mark and Chris are now being provided with, I believe we will start to see some real results at club level from 2016 onwards. Their roles are part of the AFL Victoria Western & North Western Development Council. We the EDFL, WRFL and AFL Victoria make up the development council which is chaired by Western Bulldogs President, Peter Gordon.

The council is working on ways of providing more opportunity for children to experience Australian Rules and to better integrate the efforts of all bodies involved including clubs, schools, Auskick and AFL. We are confident that new partnerships will be created to increase participation in Australian Rules.

There were many on-field highlights in 2015. In Premier Division, Aberfeldie finally shook the gorilla from their back and broke a long premiership

drought. Aberfeldie's Grand Final performance was the most comprehensive of the modern era. However, reality soon hits home when Angus Graham departs after a superb cameo performance. With the depth and resources available, Aberfeldie have the ability to remain the benchmark over coming seasons.

In Division 1, Essendon Dousta Stars put the disappointment of 2014 behind them by bouncing back at the first attempt. Previously when relegated, they took many years to return to the top division. However, this time under the astute leadership of Dean Wallis, their stay in Division 1 was short-lived. Essendon Dousta Stars are better equipped in 2016 to handle the demands of Premier Division football.

In Division 2, Hadfield where similar in that they bounced back at the first attempt. Hadfield had a dominant 2015 season on the back of an impressive array of young talent. Hadfield's challenge now is to keep the group together and develop further as they return to Division 1 football.

Junior football generally flies under the radar, however those of us fortunate enough to witness the Under 16 Division 1 Grand Final would have seen the emerging talent of Cameron Rayner. There is a long way to go for Cameron and a lot of hard work, however on his performances during 2015, anything is possible.

Off-field in 2015 we welcomed two new life members in John Larkins and Kevin Donnelly. Both are well known throughout the EDFL.

John Larkins has devoted many years to the Aberfeldie Football Club in various administration roles, starting in the juniors and progressing through to club president. John leads a strong and vibrant Aberfeldie Football Club who is admired by all throughout community football. In premiership years one never likes to individualise, however I think all would agree that John thoroughly deserved the ultimate success of 2015. It must also be noted of the many years of support and service that John has provided the EDFL at an executive level, through is input to the rules committee and legal matters that have arisen over the years. John

is a real gentleman and a great EDFL man.

Whereas John is a one-club person, Kevin Donnelly has devoted many years' service to many clubs and the EDFL. Kevin's first association goes way back to when his father played in a premiership with Keilor Football Club back in the 30s. Kevin himself played over 200 games with the Moonee Ponds Football Club. Kevin also had an association with the Ascot Vale Football Club, Aberfeldie Park Football Club, Greenvale Football Club and Airport West Football Club. However Kevin is probably more noted for his involvement with the EDFL for his role in establishing the media as we know it today. For over 10 years Kevin presented a twice-a-week program on 98.9 NWFM discussing all things EDFL. Kevin introduced a live radio coverage of the EDFL best and fairest count from the rooms of the Airport West Football Club. Kevin also introduced live broadcasts from Di Caprios that was regularly attended by over 200 people. Even today, Kevin's impact is still seen on Grand Final day with the Dash for Cash. It must be noted that Kevin's devotion to the EDFL and the media was all at Kevin's expense, which is a true show of one's passion.

Both John and Kevin have been long time EDFL people who are recognised and acknowledge by all for their devotion to community football. John and Kevin have given outstanding service over many years and are worthy inductees as life members of the EDFL. Congratulations to you both.

I would like to thank my fellow board members and staff of the league. They all contribute significantly to the administration of a competition we can all be proud of.

To the clubs and in particular club presidents and your committees, thank you for your contribution and outstanding achievements.

When you think that on any weekend through players, umpires, parents, supporters, club members, club administrators and sponsors, over 20,000 people are entertained by the EDFL, that's something you should all be extremely proud of.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

The EDFL continues to take positive strides forward and in 2015 many achievements were recorded.

A period of stability was experienced at the top with Brett Scott as Chairman and Wayne Anthony, Arthur Crofts, Romy Gutbier, Bernie Shinnars and Tanya Taylor remaining on the Board. The only change was the retirement of Glenn Allison, who stood down after a long period of involvement with the EDFL spanning 20 years which included stints at Greenvale, Maribymong Park and a number of years as an EDFL Director. Glenn's contribution to the EDFL has been tremendous.

On a sad note, the passing of Northern Saints player Mohammed 'Moe' Allouche was heartbreaking for everyone involved. Captain of the Northern Saints reserves team, Moe tragically passed away on the football field, having just kicked a goal for his team. Moe's family, friends and team mates continue to remain in the thoughts of the entire EDFL community.

FOOTBALL

A number of premiership droughts were broken. Aberfeldie won their first Grand Final in 20 years and their first at the highest echelon of the EDFL in 41 years when they defeated Greenvale in the Strathmore Community Bank Premier Division. In the Essendon Ford Division 1, competition Essendon Dousta Stars ended a 16-year senior premiership drought with victory over Craigieburn, whilst Hadfield won their first senior premiership in 26 years in the Strathmore Community Bank Division 2 competition with their win over Jacana.

The three senior divisions continue to serve the league well and the number of competitive matches at the lower levels continues to prove that the decision to expand to a three-divisional structure was, and remains, in the best interests of the EDFL and our clubs.

The junior re-grading continues to be remodelled and improved to provide the balance between competitive matches for players and logistical issues for clubs.

This season 27 clubs competed in junior finals. Further, 20 clubs competed in a Grand Final with 15 of those clubs achieving Premiership success. The spread of success in the junior competitions has been tremendously positive for the EDFL.

There was an increase of 16 additional underage teams in Season 2015, proving that Australian Football continues to increase its participation base.

It was pleasing to see the introduction of a Thirds competition (second reserves) for those clubs with an excess of reserves players. What was even more pleasing was the ability of these six clubs to introduce these Thirds teams without an adverse impact on the ability of neighbouring clubs to field their reserves teams. The net result was an ability to provide 132 players a game of football when they otherwise would have walked away from the game.

All up the EDFL fielded 318 teams in 2015, an increase of 22 teams on the previous season.

UMPIRING

The EDFL made the bold decision to heavily increase our investment in our umpiring department by up-grading Rowan Sawers' Director of Umpire position from part-time to full-time in 2015.

The result was immediate with an increase of 63 additional umpires, bringing the EDFL's total umpiring numbers to 517 and providing the EDFL clubs with the second-largest umpiring group in Victoria.

EDFL JUDICIARY

The EDFL Tribunal is a critical component of the competition and I would like to thank every member of the EDFL tribunal, appeals panel, investigators and conciliators. In particular I would like to thank Tribunal Chairman Trevor Humphries and Vice-Chairman Chris Sullivan.

AFL VICTORIA

The EDFL continues to strengthen our relationship with AFL Victoria, with the co-funded Football Development Manager positions highlighting this fact. The addition of Chris Johnson and Mark Morgan to the EDFL management team to concentrate on development within the EDFL's boundaries is proving positive and the long-term benefits of these appointments will put the EDFL and the game of Australian Football in an enviable position to that of our competitors.

The increase in development resources has allowed football to return to the schools in Melbourne's North West with 30 schools and over 2800 students participating in football programs in 2015; football within schools was an area which had previously been neglected.

Chris and Mark are also assisting in creating direct relationships between EDFL clubs and their local schools with the view to increasing transition rates of students into junior football, the priority being the EDFL's most vulnerable clubs.

Both Chris and Mark have proven to be valuable additions to the EDFL team and it has been a delight to work with each of these men in development initiatives within the EDFL's boundaries.

As an affiliate of AFL Victoria I would like to acknowledge the support and assistance AFL Victoria, in particular Chief Executive Officer Steven Reaper, Community Football and Engagement Manager Brett Connell and Metropolitan Football Manager Michael Daniher.

FINANCIAL

The EDFL continued its strong financial performance of recent years.

Annual turnover has exceeded the \$2 million mark and a positive financial result has been posted for 2015 - the sixth consecutive year the organisation has posted a profit. Most pleasing is the ability of the EDFL to absorb a number of increased expenses without the need to increase club affiliation fees or introduce player registration fees as has been the case in a number of other leagues.

This positive financial result has largely been achieved off the back of a 13 per cent increase in sponsorship, an increase in finals revenue and prudent financial management aimed at minimising expenses.

EDFL PARTNERS

I must extend my appreciation to the Strathmore Community Bank, who is a wonderful partner of the EDFL and a number of our football clubs. The Strathmore Community Bank is the naming rights sponsor of the senior Premier Division and Division 2 competitions. The support from Chairman Peter McKie, Secretary Peter Brown and all the directors and bank staff has been tremendous and has allowed the EDFL to introduce a number of new initiatives without the need to increase the financial burden on our clubs.

I must also acknowledge the support from Essendon Ford as the naming rights sponsor of the Divis



ion 1 competition, Apprenticeships Group Australia as the naming rights sponsor of the EDFL's Under 18.5 competitions and Just Cuts as the major sponsor of the EDFL's juniors.

A suite of other sponsors includes Ascot Vale Sports and Trophies, Brad Teal Real Estate, Club Warehouse, Coburg Physiotherapy, Elastoplast, Essendon Football Club, G.J. Gardner Homes, Glenroy Bakery, Grashan Sportswear, Hot Sub, Hypoxi Moonee Ponds, Just Cuts, Lionheart Security, M&A Wilson Signs, Moonee Valley Racing Club, Orbit Logistics, Pascoe Vale Hotel, P.W. Glass, Red Onion Creative, Sherrin, Sportsmoves, The Meadows and Ubersecrets, to whom the EDFL is extremely appreciative of their support.

WINDY HILL

The EDFL's long-standing negotiations with Essendon Football Club are nearing a close with the imminent relocation of the EDFL's administration offices to Windy Hill.

The relocation to Windy Hill will provide the EDFL with a more professional outlook and importantly will bring together our administration base with our umpires training ground and finals venue.

I must thank Kevin Dixon of Essendon for his support and patience throughout the negotiation period and through Kevin a strong relationship between the EDFL and the Essendon Football Club has been created.

I must also acknowledge the Mayor of Moonee Valley City Council Narelle Sharpe and her fellow Councillors for the support of the Moonee Valley City Council during this negotiation period.

APPRECIATION

I extend my appreciation to the EDFL Board of Management for their support and guidance and to the EDFL staff of Greta May (Football Operations/Admin Manager), Steph Zerowsky (Football Operations Officer), Michael Russell (Community Relations Officer), Adem Saricaoglu (Media Officer), Rowan Sawers (Director of Umpiring) and Ken Waters (Umpires Administration Officer).

I must acknowledge the hard work and support of Teo Pellizzeri, who left a positive impact on the league after six seasons of involvement in a media capacity that culminated in his appointment as the EDFL's first full-time Media Officer.

Finally, thank you to all volunteers involved in all EDFL clubs and congratulations on a magnificent 2015 season. It is the dedication and commitment of club volunteers that is the lifeblood of community football and it is a credit to everyone at club land for the health and vibrancy of the EDFL.

The season culminated in a very good display of umpiring in the junior and senior finals, which is a real credit to the efforts of everyone involved. To achieve such a positive result is testament to the resilience, flexibility and team approach of the EDFL umpiring group.

EDFL currently has 517 umpires registered with 260 being involved in our Junior Program.

VIDEO CONTENT

After 'EDFL Web TV' was rewarded at the 2014 AFL Victoria Community Media Awards for 'Best Use of Online Media', a conscious effort was made to take our video product to the next level in 2015. During the pre-season a number of videos were published to our YouTube channel, including an umpiring promo and Youth Girls promo to help boost our numbers. That was followed by a club-by-club preview series in the lead-up to the season proper.

This year we welcomed Claire Varley, Adam Russell and Dave Kennedy to the EDFL Web TV cast and the response was a positive one, with the new-look line-up giving the show a fresh tone. A big thank you must go to EDFL Chairman Brett Scott and the Pascoe Vale Hotel for supporting the show and allowing a number of episodes to be shot at their venue. Also, a number of clubs gave us great access to their players and coaches throughout the year and

to be able to shoot particular segments from various clubs each week ensured every episode had a different look about it. Full access to game footage shot by Corey Clement (Red Onion Creative) allowed for significant use of highlights throughout the season.

It was great to welcome back Matt Pillios to the show for our Premier Division Grand Final Preview segment and to everyone who made 'EDFL Web TV' possible in 2015, congratulations. The show is one we can all be proud of.

Post-season, Adam Russell and I worked on three 'Extended Highlights Packages' for our senior Grand Finals, all of which were released in early October. It is hoped that in years to come, those lucky enough to be part of those flags won by Aberfeldie, Essendon Doutta Stars and Hadfield, will be able to look back at these packages and re-live their day in the sun in 2015. As of mid-November, these packages had a combined total of more than 1100 views.

RADIO COVERAGE

We have a small but loyal team that again worked extremely hard to provide our audience with an informative, yet upbeat broadcast throughout the 2015 season. Our broadcast partner, 98.9 North West FM, and in particular Jean Rau, were again outstanding with their help and support throughout the season. The unsung hero of EDFL Radio is John Dosen, NW-FM's panel operator for all of our league's weekly coverage, including 'EDFL Preview', 'EDFL Match of the Day' and 'EDFL Review'. Without John putting in countless hours at the studio, we would not have made it to air.

On the air, this year we welcomed Claire Varley, Adam Russell and Travis Poznachowski as newcomers to our coverage while, Dave Kennedy, Adrian Jamieson and I all returned as volunteers after a successful 2014 season on the airwaves. A huge thank you must also go to current Oak Park Senior Coach, Ben Chapman, who again gave up his time during the finals series to join 'EDFL Match of the Day' in the special comments chair. Ben was a great asset to our finals and Grand Final coverage. Dave McWilliam again provided our coverage with around the grounds scores in 2015.

THE FOOTBALLER

There seems to be mixed views on the currency of the printed, game-day record. I personally am an advocate of the written word and the impact it still has on the game-day experience. This year, the highlight was the opportunity to produce and write a feature article on legendary EDFL umpire and life member, Jimmy Ainsworth. His story on reaching 2000 games gained widespread exposure on social media and attracted interest from mainstream media outlets. In 2016 I hope to include many more written features in our record.

CHALLENGES AHEAD

Our use of social media is best utilised to promote all the EDFL has to offer and also showcase the quality of our on and off-field product. WHAT WERE THE POSITIVES FOR YOUR CLUB IN 2015?

HOW DID YOU RATE THE PERFORMANCE OF YOUR SENIOR GROUP IN 2015?

Something that stands out this year is of the 80 quarters played, we only lost eight for the year. Forty-two of the quarters played we kept our opposition to one goal or less. We had a relentless and team-first approach and as a group we have achieved something very special. At no stage was there any display of arrogance or lack of respect for our opponents and the team displayed the same consistency and commitment as it had from day one of the pre-season.

WHAT WAS THE MOST PLEASING ASPECT ABOUT YOUR JUNIOR GROUP IN 2015?

Once again the junior committee and its coaches focused on making our teams competitive and all-encompassing for our players in relation to their participation and on-going development. To have 10 teams make the finals, with seven qualifying for their Grand Final, exceeded what the club had hoped for. The following teams won their respective Grand Finals: Under 10 Division 3, Under 10 Division 5, Under 14 Division 1 and Under 16 Division 3. As noted last year, because the club's biggest strength lies in the junior section there is continual and specific attention paid in this area with every effort geared towards assisting junior players in the eventual transition to senior football. 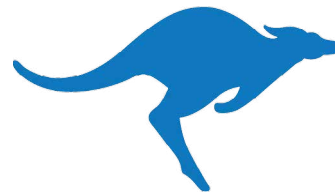

AFL VICTORIA DEVELOPMENT REPORT

It's certainly been a big year for AFL Victoria Development in the North West Region of Melbourne! With the AFL Executive having identified the North West Corridor of Melbourne as a key area of growth and expansion for the game, the Region underwent a significant restructure at the start of 2015 from a game development perspective. This effectively saw two old Regions (Calder and Western), split into five smaller Regions. The ultimate aim of this was to give our development staff the greatest opportunity to grow participation in our game, with a smaller geographical area to cover allowing us to develop stronger relationships at all levels including Auskick, schools and local community clubs.

This restructure also saw a slight shift in focus with talent outcomes becoming less of a priority, and creating strong and sustainable local community clubs being at the core of all work we undertake in the Region. This resulted in two new Football Development Manager positions within AFL Victoria being created for the Region, with both roles based full time at the EDFL offices to create a stronger working relationship between the two parties. Chris Johnson was appointed to the role of Football Development Manager – Melbourne Central, which predominately takes in the Moonee Valley and Brimbank Council areas relevant to the EDFL, while Mark Morgan started in the position of Football Development Manager – North West, which takes in the Hume and Moreland Council areas.

As mentioned previously, club development has essentially been the cornerstone of all of our work so far and everything we aim to achieve is linked back to this key aspect of the role. A key part of the long-term strategic vision we have centres around a 'District Scheme' that we have created over the course of this season. Essentially we have aligned an Auskick Centre and a cluster of schools to each club and over the next two to three years we hope to facilitate natural transition pathways between the three entities to ensure sustainable futures for all junior club programs. With the advent of the Player Points System, this work becomes even more pertinent. In addition, we will be looking to roll out a new Club Improvement Program over the off season which will allow club committees to complete an online 'health check' of all inner workings of their club – from there we will work with clubs to identify any areas that can be improved.



Ultimately we can do as much work as possible to attract participants to footy clubs, but if the environment is not conducive to retaining them, they will be lost to the game. Hence we aimed to introduce a number of initiatives this year centred on increasing the quality of coaching at this level, as coaches play such a critical role in driving this environment. We have actively encouraged all clubs to create/employ a coaching co-ordinator role within their club whose primary responsibility is to oversee the entire junior coaching group – this program will continue to grow in 2016 so we encourage all clubs to embrace it. We are also working closely with the Essendon Football Club and the Calder Cannons to create more professional development opportunities for community coaches.

The recent influx of young migrant families means the greater catchment area of the EDFL has a strong multicultural flavour to it, hence making it integral that we engage this section of the community to ensure our game continues to prosper. We now have three dedicated Multicultural Auskick Centres running in the Region which have all been hugely popular, and 2015 also saw the successful introduction of the first Diversity Academy in the Region - aligned to the Cannons, the squad aims to introduce talented athletes from other sports to our game, as well as providing invaluable personal development opportunities. Moving forward, we envisage greater collaboration with multicultural community leaders which we are confident will lead to stronger relationships and ultimately see more multicultural communities involved in our game at all levels.

This year has also seen us do a power of work in local primary schools consisting of

a number of different programs designed to introduce young kids to the game. The pinnacle of this work has seen the implementation of the Government's new 'Sporting Schools' Program which has complemented our usual offerings such as AFL 9's, Assembly Promotions, AFL Player Appearances, Footy Frenzy & various one-off clinics – all of which has seen us reach over 22,000 participants in the EDFL Region at a primary and secondary level.

With the introduction of a National Female Competition mooted for 2017, establishing a vibrant local female competition has also become incredibly important. The starting point for us is aiming to establish all girls groups at every Auskick Centre in 2016. Further, in conjunction with the EDFL we are working closely with a number of clubs who have shown a strong interest in creating some new teams for 2016. This year saw us run the Region's first 'Primary School Girls Cup' and we hope that this introduction to the game will provide a strong foundation on which to build this competition. There is now a clear pathway for young female footballers which has resulted in this aspect of our sport being the fastest growing, so it is imperative that we build a sustainable local competition that will ultimately act as a feeder to our national league.

Congratulations to everyone on the year – we hope that it was one filled with great memories and has left you with a strong appetite to remain involved in 2016. Thanks for all of your support and we hope you have a great off season.

Three Calder players took part in the Draft Combine held at Etihad Stadium in October – Nick O'Kearney, Hisham Kerbatieh and Callum Moore, as well as Karl Brown at the State Combine.

Congratulations to Bruno Laguda on his successful season, being recognised with the 2015 Robert Hyde Medal for the Best and Fairest player of the year.

Throughout 2015 over 400 players from the North West Metropolitan region of Melbourne were given the opportunity to participate in various Calder development programs from

U14 level through to the U18 TAC Cup program. With 50 players representing the Cannons in the U18 TAC Cup in 2015, 28 of them were EDFL players, making up 56 per cent of the squad.

A huge thank you to the EDFL and staff, and all clubs, administrators and coaches of the EDFL for the dedication you continue to provide to the integral grounding and development of many young footballers that we are lucky enough to work with. Without the support of all local clubs in our region, the Calder Cannons would not be the proud and successful club that it is. - Lachlan Fogarty won the Most Valuable Player award for Vic Metro at the AFL U16 Championships and was subsequently selected in the AFL/ AIS academy squad.

- Lachlan Fogarty, Cameron Rayner, Kyle Hudson & Daniel Venables were selected in the AFL U16 Vic Metro team for the AFL U16 National Championships.

- Jackson Volpato was the highest vote winner at the Morrish Medal with eight votes.

- Lachlan Knight won the Western Jets Best & Fairest Award, the Barry Round Medal.

- The club again participated in the AFL Victoria multicultural program with the Majak Daw Squad.

- The Western Jets once again were recognised for their excellent off-field contribution to the Transport Accident Commission.

The club was again very active off the field in conjunction with our aligned VFL partner, the Williamstown Football Club. Negotiations with Hobson's Bay Council have been taking place throughout the year with the view of establishing a summer training facility. The venue identified is Lynch Reserve, which is ideally located between Crofts Reserve and Burbank Oval and is also situated on Mason Street only a short distance from the offices of the Williamstown and Western Jets Football Clubs. The Newport Leisure Centre is also situated on site and would provide gymnasium and swimming facilities. It is envisaged in the initial stages that a full-size ground will be established along with ground lighting, improved irrigation system, goal post and netting behind the goals. The advent of a full-sized ground for summer training would be an outstanding result for the development and preparation of players during this important part of the season.

The Western Jets were again actively involved in the Vocational Educational and Training program (VET) in the western suburbs. Four schools participated in the program, Essendon Keilor College (since 1998), Caroline Springs SC (2007), Manor Lakes College and Point Cook SC (in recent years). Participation in the program allows students to complete a TAFE certificate along side their tertiary studies and also provides the opportunity to develop their football ability with timetabled skill, physical development and competition. Since the inception of the program in 1998, 30 students have been drafted into the AFL competition. The club again participated in multicultural/diversity football being one of four regions to participate in the second term program. It is pleasing to report that there were again excellent numbers involved and that the Majak Daw Squad was the winner of the round robin event. The Jets also made their first step in women's football assisting a combination of TAC Cup and VFL clubs establishing a western region team. Once again our staff have made an outstanding contribution. Torin Baker continued at the club and added Maribyrnong SC to his duties. At our presentation night, Steve Turner and Jay Ellis were recognised with life membership for outstanding service. Emily Hole was rewarded with the 'Club Person of the Year' award for her excellent year. In all, 50 staff members performed a variety of jobs from coaching, administration, medical and talent identification. My sincere thanks to Steve Turner, who once again made an outstanding contribution and to our office manager, Jordan Doyle.

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Vic) and the Associations Incorporation Reform Regulations 2012 (Vic). The committee has determined that the League is not a reporting entity.

The statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Vic) and the Associations Incorporation Reform Regulations 2012 (Vic) and the following Australian Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous periods unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

(a) Income Tax

The League is exempt from Income Tax pursuant to section 50-45 and section 50-1 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, on all income received.

(b) Fixed Assets

Freehold Land and Buildings are brought to account at cost or independent or committee member's valuation.

Office Equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(c) Revenue

Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the entity and the revenue can be reliably measured.

Interest revenue is recognised when it is actually received from the financial institutions.

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits to be settled within one (1) year together with benefits arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and such leave which will be settled after one (1) year, have been measured at their nominal amount. Other employee benefits payable later than one (1) year have been measured at present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

Contributions are made by the association to an employee superannuation fund and are charged when the expense is occurred.

(e) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash on hand and in banks and short term deposits are stated at nominal value. For the purposes of the Cash Flow Statement, cash includes cash on hand and in banks and money market instruments, readily convertible to cash within two (2) working days, net of outstanding bank overdrafts.

(f) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

NOTE 2: RELATED PARTIES

During the year ended 31 October, 2015, there were no related party transactions entered into by the League with members of the Committee.

NOTE 3: CHANGE IN ACCOUNTING POLICY

There have been no changes made to the Accounting Policies adopted by the Committee for the financial year ended 31 October, 2015.

NOTE 4: SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

There are no subsequent events to these accounts that the League's committee is aware of that would have a material effect on them.

NOTE 5: FUTURE COMMITMENTS

The Committee has entered into a commitment to lease alternate premises at an estimated rental of \$25,000 per annum. The future of the League Headquarters at 14 Marshall Road, Airport West remains undetermined, and should a re-development proceed, it will have the potential to reduce the cash flow reserves, which in turn will reduce the income earning capacity of those reserves.


Qualification
