

## **Chairman**

VER the past five years the EDFL has experienced many significant changes, changes that we believe have made the EDFL a stronger and more relevant brand. Community football as we know it has changed dramatically and will continue to change in the foreseeable future. Unfortunately, if we as a league or you as clubs do not embrace change, then we will all be left behind.

#### Growth

The relocation to Windy Hill cannot be underestimated in providing the EDFL with a superior vehicle in which to attract quality people to our competition. It has provided us with facilities to be able to better administer the EDFL. If we had not relocated, we would not have been able to support the competition and manage the growth we have experienced.

When we talk about growth there are two significant areas - players and umpires. The EDFL has grown by over 100 teams in the past five years and by over 150 umpires in the same time frame.

An extra 100-plus teams equates to an extra 2000-plus players. When you factor in parents and membership, they are significant numbers.

The EDFL reached a stage where we were asking clubs to provide club umpires, a poor reflection of an admired competition. However, over the past five years we have grown to 500-plus umpires each year, which again is a significant achievement. What makes this achievement even greater is that each year we lose 150 umpires. Our aim is to reduce the turnover of umpires, an area that you the clubs can have a significant impact upon. Both these areas will continue to increase.

### **Club Finance**

Possibly the greatest achievement is the financial status of all EDFL clubs. Whilst the administering of the clubs' financial status

has been met with some angst, it has set the EDFL up to control its own destiny. I doubt there is another community competition anywhere that can proudly say that all its members are financial. We do not want to revert to the past where clubs were borrowing from the future to pay for the present.

### Interleague

In 2017 the EDFL played the Eastern Football League at Bayswater for the right to challenge in 2018 for the title of number one community football league in Victoria. In a high-quality, fast-paced game and despite having more scoring shots, we went down by two points with the last kick of the game shaving the goal post. To our coaches, players and support staff, thank you for your efforts in preparing the EDFL for a quality competition. If there is to be a negative, then it is that not one player who finished in the top 10 of the EDFL best-and-fairest made themselves available for selection.

#### **Board**

In times of change, strength and stability of administration plays a vital part in the ongoing success of any organisation. To board members Bernie Shinners, Wayne Anthony, Tanya Taylor, Romy Gutbier and Rob Castellas, I would like to thank you for your significant contribution and your tireless commitment to the EDFL. You the clubs can be assured that we are committed to a strong, vibrant EDFL.

### **Premiers**

In Premier Division, Aberfeldie cemented their status as the number one club in the EDFL. Under the strong astute leadership of John Larkins and Adam Potter, Aberfeldie have finally embraced their strong junior program and have got the correct mix on-field. This strong on-field, off-field combination could see a dynasty of which we have not seen before.





In Division 1, Glenroy finally had the chance to invest in their on-field activities after years of dedication to improve the facilities at Sewell Reserve. With a loyal and long-term committed administration led by EDFL stalwarts Adrian McDonald, Murray Nilsson and Ross Terranova, Glenroy will be more than prepared for the rigors of Premier Division. Jacana made their intention clear early on with the recruitment of Cameron Cloke. With strong off-field leadership from Rick Lloyd and Khan Sayers combined with a new on-field team led by Robert Fletcher, they delivered the ultimate prize to their loyal supporter group. The step up to Division 1 will be difficult, however Jacana has again made its intention clear with the recruitment of Josh Young and Jason Cloke.

### **Challenges Ahead**

There are many challenges facing the EDFL in 2018 and beyond, including fixturing, grounds, facilities, female football, netball, finances, finals, sponsorship, Windy Hill and succession planning.

Two of the biggest challenges and concerns are the salary and player points caps. The theory behind both models is sound with long-term sustainability paramount for all. However, equalisation by restriction in an uneven arena is fraught with danger. One may ask how a club improves its ladder position when restricted by salary and point caps. The last thing we want the system to do is eliminate hope and ambition. If all clubs are meeting the league's affiliation requirements, why should we then restrict the clubs' resources? It is worth noting that our Premier Division grand finalists, Aberfeldie and Greenvale, played with 32 and 31 points respectively. An unfortunate by-product of the modern football era is the increase in the layers of administration. Are we making it to difficult?

## **Chief Executive**

SEASON 2017 has been another year of growth and change within the Essendon District Football League. It has been pleasing to see the hard work of volunteers at clubs being effective in sustaining and managing growth on a year-by-year basis. This continued growth ensures the EDFL maintains its position as one of the leading community football competitions in metropolitan Melbourne.

### **League Growth**

A change to the constitution allowed new clubs to enter the EDFL as affiliated members. The 2017 season saw Coburg, St Francis, Sunbury Lions and VU Western Spurs officially recognised as affiliated clubs of the EDFL. All four clubs had previously participated in EDFL competitions, but 2017 was the first time that these clubs were able to call themselves EDFL clubs as associate members of the EDFL. In addition, Ascot Vale became an affiliated member of the EDFL in 2017. It is a return to the past, with the Ascot Vale name having a connection to the EDFL dating back to 1930. Team numbers surged to 377 teams competing in the EDFL. This is an increase of 45 teams from 2016, or roughly 1000 more participants playing football than we had last year. When extended out, this figure of 377 is an increase of 88 teams, or roughly 2000 participants when compared to the 2013 season when there were 289 teams competing in the EDFL.

The biggest growth has come through female football participation, with 28 more teams competing in the EDFL this season. Pleasingly, 2017 saw the EDFL introduce an open-age Women's competition. Run jointly with the Western Region Football League, the competition featured seven teams from EDFL clubs and four teams from WRFL clubs. This new competition proved to be successful and it is expected that both the EDFL and the WRFL will have sufficient numbers to field stand-alone Women's competitions in 2018. Congratulations to Keilor for winning the inaugural EDFL Women's Competition. As the population continues to expand within the EDFL's boundaries and the demand for more football participation opportunities increase, the EDFL will continue to grow and it is important that we are prepared for, and embrace this growth.

### **Club Sustainability Program**

The second phase of AFL Victoria's Club Sustainability Program was introduced this year with the Player Payment Rule (salary cap) implemented in community football across Victoria. This followed the 2016 introduction of the Player Points System Policy. These two policies have been introduced with the aim of reducing player payments,

which has continued to rise year-on-year and simultaneously created more competitive competitions around the state.

It is too soon to determine what impact the Club Sustainability Program will have on its stated aims, but it has been great to see all clubs take on the salary cap and player points system and work within the boundaries of these policies.

#### **Financial**

The EDFL continues to maintain a strong financial position and I am pleased to report an operating profit of \$17,901 for the 2016/17 financial year. Turnover has increased by 5.78 per cent to over \$2.3 million. Whilst expenses increased by 4.64 per cent, the rate of the increase being lower than the increase in income resulted in a net profit for the EDFL.

### **EDFL Partners**

I must extend my appreciation to the Strathmore Community Bank, who is a wonderful partner of the EDFL and many of our football clubs. The Strathmore Community Bank is the naming rights sponsor of the senior Premier Division and Division 2 competitions. The continued support of the Strathmore Community Bank is felt not only by the EDFL, but also the wider community. This support and generosity has seen the Strathmore

The support from chairman Peter Brown and all the directors and bank staff has been tremendous and has allowed the EDFL to introduce new initiatives and grow the competition to the benefit of EDFL clubs and the

I welcome Pauline Leslie, who is the EDFL's first dedicated resource for female participation, focussing on growing female football and establishing a netball competition. I must make special mention of the hard work and support of Stuart Balloch and Gavin Mahony, both of whom left a positive impact on the league.

I would like to acknowledge the support of AFL Victoria, in particular CEO, Steven Reaper, Metropolitan Football Manager, Mick Daniher and Club Sustainability Manager, Darryl Collings.

### Goodbye

In what is my final year with the EDFL I would like to acknowledge every club official that I have had the pleasure to be involved with in my time in the EDFL. It is the dedication and commitment of club volunteers that is the lifeblood of community football and it is a credit to everyone at club land for the health and vibrancy of the EDFL.

I am proud that I have contributed to positive change within the EDFL. When looking back over the past eight seasons, the EDFL has grown from 293 teams in 2010 to 377 teams and affiliated clubs has increased from 24 to 32. There have been many structural changes including three senior divisions, revamping the junior grading, changing the junior age groups, introducing the Thirds competition, introducing female football, increasing staff from three to nine and relocating the offices to Windy Hill.

I am also proud that during my tenure the EDFL has posted accumulated profits in excess of \$330,000, ensuring we are in a stronger financial position from when I started. Thank you for the memories.

With the number of games per weekend only increasing, the time, commitment and enthusiasm you invest is extraordinary. Thank you for providing all players and coaches with the opportunity to take part in the game.

#### **Youth Football**

This year marked the transition from even to odd age-groups as we conducted U9, U11, U13, U15 and U17 competitions for the first time, with over 240 teams involved across the junior competitions. Congratulations to all grand finalists and premiership-winning teams for 2017 and the spirit in which the games were played in.

To Ron Sikora, Darryl Maher, Troy Newton, Jarrad Carey, John Singarella, Roy Fishenden and Keith Kasmiatos and your staff, thank you for your willingness to lead, teach and develop all participants involved in the 2017 Interleague Program.

To Keilor, Burnside Heights, East Keilor, Moonee Valley, Avondale Heights, Essendon Doutta Stars, Keilor Park and Taylors Lakes, thank you for opening your facilities to us for training and also hosting fantastic game days.

In addition, thank you to the Essendon Football Club, who is a great supporter of our program. We are proud of our partnerships with the Calder Cannons and Western Jets and the youth development pathways that help shape talented players into not only great footballers, but people as well. Thanks to Ian Kyte (Calder Cannons) and Shane Sexton (Western Jets) for your tireless efforts and the hard work of your staffing groups.

Lastly, thank you to Tanya Taylor for your commitment to the future of our young footballers with your junior portfolio.

### **Junior Girls Program**

In the inaugural year of standalone EDFL Girls Football there was exponential growth. Girls Football continued to assert its influence on the football world. Pathways are now becoming clearly defined and the prospects of the game look bright.

In 2017 the number of registered girls in the EDFL grew from 308 to 1156, an increase of 1464 members in total. The U12 competition increased fourfold, the U15 competition more than doubled and the U18 competition included one extra team. Overall, of the 28 affiliated EDFL clubs, 17 clubs had at least one team participating in the Girls or Women's competitions. In addition, three associate clubs had at least one team.

Credit must go to the clubs who have been on a mission to make football clubs a place for all, especially the champions of Girls Football. Your passion for the game is infectious.

### **Senior Women**

What an exciting time it has been for women in football, with the AFLW competition having taken off, momentum carried down to the grassroots levels. Due to the disbandment of the VWFL at the end of the 2016 season, we conducted our first EDFL Women's Competition in conjunction with the WRFL, with seven EDFL clubs taking part. The Junior Girls & Senior Women's Grand Final Day was a great success. The skills on show were fantastic and supporters came out in numbers to sit on the hills and cheer the girls on. Congratulations to all grand finalists and our deserving premiers. Be proud of what you achieved and the future you are creating.

### **Tribunal & Member Protection**

Thank you must go out to all members of the EDFL Tribunal and Member Protection Program – be it tribunal members, tribunal co-ordinators or secretaries, investigation officers, vilification officers or tribunal advocates who reviewed each case on its merits and sought to make this league safe and fair for all participants, umpires, staff and spectators. This is an essential but thankless job and one that ensures the sustainability of this league.

### Umpiring

Thank you to the EDFL Umpiring duo Rowan Sawers and Ken Waters. Weekends during the season would not have run as smoothly without your co-operation and dedication. Thanks also to the umpiring coaches and all umpires who took to the field in 2017.

### Saturday Football - U19.5 & Open Age

The finals series delivered some nail-biters in 2017. We had draws, teams making grand finals from fourth, and superb skills on display.



Congratulations to all teams who participated in the finals series and those who made it to the biggest days of the year. To all 2017 premiers, well done. Grand finals are won by volunteers, supporters, coaches and the entire playing group as much as they are won by the 22 that represent the club on the day. Thank you to Keilor, Glenroy, Greenvale, Hadfield, Coburg and West Coburg Football Clubs for your efforts in hosting the senior finals. To our Gate Management Group headed by Sue and Phil Aston and led by Fiona at Windy Hill, you are a tremendous asset. Thank you for your continued support. Thanks also to the Senior Interleague Coaching team for 2017 led by Brodie Holland, Geoff Maddern and support crew. We faced off against the Eastern Football League in a nail-biting senior interleague match at Bayswater Oval and almost got over the line with one of the last kicks of the day.

### **Looking Ahead**

Season 2018 promises to be even bigger and better for the EDFL with the Women's Competition to become stand-alone as a number of new teams take part. The addition of U9, U11 and U13 divisions for the Girls competitions will be the exciting next step for under-age Girls football.

Get ready for some close rivalries with Glenroy heading up to Premier Division and Jacana to Division 1 and competitive junior divisions. Our home-and-away season will be headlined by Good Friday, ANZAC Day, NAIDOC Round, MND Round and Mother's Day Round matches.

I eagerly anticipate Season 2018 and look forward to working with all clubs and stakeholders, to facilitate a competition for everybody to be a part of.

### Website

Our largest project in 2017 was to deliver a new website for the EDFL. While this process began in 2016, we worked tirelessly to create a brand new league website that will best service the EDFL community for years to come. On Wednesday June 14, the new essendondfl.com.au went live, with a clean, bright new look with increased functionality and most importantly, a mobile-friendly user experience. I'd like to congratulate my fellow EDFL colleagues from each department for their contributions in producing this new website. Their support was immense throughout the process.

### **Social Media**

The power of social media is the direct to consumer nature in which we can inform our community and promote our content. In 2017 we again looked to go bigger and better, and actively explored new ways to utilise our platforms. For the first time, we had two dedicated social media producers as part of our media team. ### **EDFL Live App**

In 2017, we nearly doubled our traffic on our official mobile app. The EDFL Team App was re-branded for the 2017 season and promoted as the one-stop shop for all EDFL match day and weekly content, including live scores, live radio, news (including team selection) and other multi-media content. The newly-branded EDFL Live App was a huge success, with more than 200,000 screen views through to the end of September, an increase of nearly 90,000 views from the 2016 season.

Facebook reach, boasting more than 9000

followers by the end of September.

We as a league must embrace new communication technologies and learn how to best utilise them moving forward.

### **Radio & Podcast Content**

It was another solid year for EDFL Match of the Day and we can remain proud of the quality match day coverage provided. The fact I was able to occasionally step back and allow my colleagues to broadcast games while I attended other games is a massive credit to the entire team. Each and every broadcaster we have is extremely committed to the product. I'd like to thank my fellow play-by-play commentators Michael Pepicelli and Travis Poznachowski for another outstanding season. In special comments we had Adam Russell, Adrian Jamieson and during the finals, Westmeadows coach Dave Connell do an outstanding job of providing insight and colour to our coverage. Finally, I'd like to also thank boundary riders Damien Peck and Ben McManus for doing the hard yards at ground level during what was a bitter winter. This year's highlight was our first ever broadcast of a female game of football - the inaugural Senior Women's Grand Final between Keilor and Manor Lakes. Another major success story this season was EDFL Tonight. In our second year, we increased the show's panel from two to five regular hosts, and the results were a very impressive jump in our podcast numbers from 2016. To my co-hosts Adrian Jamieson, Adam Papal, Julia Montesano and Adam Russell, thank you for making Wednesday nights so enjoyable in 2017. Podcast is a very important, growing medium and we are dedicated to increasing our podcast presence in 2018

Finally, we must again show our gratitude to North West FM, our long-standing radio partner that helped us broadcast both *EDFL Match of the Day* and *EDFL Tonight* in 2017. In particular, I must thank John Dosen for the countless hours he spends in the studio putting our content to air each week. Without John, the show does not go on.

### **Video Content**

While it served us greatly, we made the tough decision to cancel *EDFL Web TV* in favour of shorter, more diverse video content in 2017. This year we introduced *EDFL 2017*, a semi-regular short-form video series that covered many areas of the EDFL. The new show had a fresh style and face, and I'd like to thank Julia Montesano for her outstanding work as the host of *EDFL 2017*. Her commitment to the product, both on-camera and in post-production, was second to none. It was a true pleasure to work with her.

In 2017 the league took an important step forward in committing to increased filming of



senior football. We entered into partnership with SportsCast Australia to film five senior EDFL games per week during the 2017 homeand-away season. This allowed us to provide significantly more match day video content than ever before, and our weekly highlights packages proved to be a very popular item on our social media platforms.

Both EDFL 2017 and SportsCast match highlights combined to deliver our most impressive increase in engagement across all EDFL Media content in 2017. For all video content, in 2016 we had just over 28,000 total views for the season. That number exploded to over 431,000 total views in 2017.

### Record

The EDFL's official match day record, *The Footballer*, remains our most traditional weekly media product. However, as each year goes by, the humble record is slowly losing its resonance, particularly with the advancement of mobile technology and within our league, the growing success of the EDFL Live App. It remains an on-going challenge to keep the record relevant, but we'll keep looking to find ways of increasing its relevance in the future. This year we had three regular writers contribute to *The Footballer*, and I'd like to thank Julia Montesano, Jacob Manzie and Liam McAllion for their work in 2017.

### **Photography**

Finally, I must acknowledge and thank Jamie Morey for his tireless work as the EDFL's official photographer in 2017. Jamie's work features prominently on many EDFL Media products including *essendondfl.com.au*, *The Footballer* and our various social media platforms. Jamie is a wonderfully talented and hardworking photographer, and he is a tremendous asset to the EDFL.

# **Umpiring**

IRSTLY, I would like to thank all umpires and coaches for their efforts throughout the 2017 season. Umpiring throws up many challenges on and off-field and the way our umpiring team in the EDFL has stepped up to the challenges in a professional manner needs to be commended and is appreciated greatly.

Umpires play an integral part in our game to ensure the game is played by the rules in a fair manner but most importantly, to protect players from injury in what is a physical game. Player welfare is paramount. So is the welfare of our umpires.

Coaches at all levels from U11s to Seniors have an impact beyond winning as they are the respected leader of their team/club and have a significant influence in the way umpires are treated game day. I seek the assistance of all coaches to create a positive, respectful game day environment to ensure we continue to retain and attract new umpires. A positive relationship between players, coaches, clubs and umpires enhances the competition and makes for a successful EDFL.

### **Highlights**

EDFL umpires now have many opportunities outside the EDFL game day experience to grow and develop. There was an opportunity to umpire BHP Cup games on the MCG and corporate matches at Etihad Stadium. Many of our junior umpires took part in the Metropolitan Junior Championship, including the Under 15 Division 1 Grand Final. We also had eight senior umpires selected to umpire in the Interleague Championship, while EDFL umpires had a strong presence in the AFL IC17 matches with Michael McGinnis and Frank Dicosmo selected to umpire the grand final at the MCG.

AFLUSA visited training during the AFL IC17 to share their experiences. Through their visit, three EDFL umpires participated in USAFL Championship matches in San Diego, California. They went on to officiate in the Division 1 and Division 2 USAFL Grand Finals. Field umpires participated in the Tom Lahiff Cup and the Multicultural Cup matches and our female umpires umpired the AFLVIC Female Promotional Match at Etihad Stadium. EDFL umpires became the face of the new AFL National Umpiring recruitment promotional campaign and controlled State School Championships and Herald Sun Shield matches held at Rams Arena.

AFL and VFL umpires conducted training sessions at Windy Hill several times during the season and Rob Findlay and Jacob Mollison (AFL field umpires) addressed our youth umpires at a special recognition night. Jordan Bannister and Andrew Coates (former AFL umpires) attended our junior presentation night. Andrew presented the Ian Coates

Shield to George Touma, who was acknowledged the best junior umpire in 2017. AFL legend David Parkin addressed our junior and senior field umpires.

There was an article in the AFL Record acknowledging involvement of women in umpiring in the EDFL and our umpires were also involved in the AFL Victoria's Mate's Program, AFL Rookies Program and Female Umpiring Academy.

### **Junior Field Umpiring**

Our Junior Field Umpiring Mission is to 'provide a fun, positive and engaging learning environment to teach our group the necessary skills of umpiring and enhance their personal development through a professional and innovative coaching program'. Season 2017 saw 240 junior umpires participate 'on-field' this season, with 64 first-year umpires joining the program. With the increase in Girls teams, our appointments averaged 230 each weekend, totalling approximately 4000 appointments across the season, including finals.

The EDFL provides eight Youth Training Centres across our region with two new centres located at Craigieburn and East Sunbury. These academies are a tremendous asset for the EDFL to engage umpires from all areas across the region. Thanks to Coburg Districts, Craigieburn, Jacana and East Sunbury Football Clubs for allowing us to use their facilities

Lachlan Coyne and Patrick Sexton represented the EDFL in the AFL Auskick program. Victoria Metropolitan Championships saw many of our umpires being involved in U13s, 14s and 15s matches. EDFL field umpires Allison Rogers, Riley Manning and George Touma were appointed to the Division 1 U15 Grand Final.

Our junior umpires visited the Essendon Football Club training facility for an AFL training experience.

The Junior Finals Series was highly-successful across all age groups and divisions. The umpiring displayed was professional and of an excellent standard, with welcomed support from clubs who demonstrated positive behaviour.

# **AFL Victoria Development**

T has certainly been another big year of growth, innovation and development for AFL Victoria in the North West region of Melbourne!

### **Schools**

This year has again seen us put a heavy focus on ensuring that our game has a very strong presence in as many local schools as possible. Our relationship with schools has continued to improve, and ultimately allowed us to run programs throughout the region involving interactions with over 20,000 students. The flagship of this suite of offers to schools remains the Australian Sports Commission's 'Sporting Schools Program', but also includes Auskick Assembly Promotions, Footy Frenzy Days, AFL 9s and one-off clinics, AFL player appearances and Multicultural School Programs. In addition, this year saw our Primary Schools Challenge event grow again and culminated with a Regional Finals Day at Windy Hill which proceeded the State Final held at Victoria Park.

We have expanded our school offering in the greater Broadmeadows area this year to include the Physical Literacy Program, which utilises funding from the Hume City Council, Australian Sports Commission, AFL Victoria and the EDFL to run ongoing AFL Programs in local schools. These programs entail before, during and after school components aimed at introducing local students to the game. The highlight of this program for 2017 was the establishment of four new After School Auskick Centres and we will look to build upon this foundation in the future.

### **Multicultural Engagement**

We have continued to strive to engage multicultural communities through a number of different initiatives throughout 2017. We again rolled out our Diversity Squad in conjunction with the Calder Cannons – this year called the David Zaharakis Squad - putting 25 boys through a 10-week program that culminated in a round robin against other Diversity Squads from around the state – again, a very enriching program for all involved. With the Essendon NGA completing its first full year in operation, this will be an area that we devote a lot of energy to in 2018.

### **District Scheme**

Following on from the implementation of our District Scheme in 2016, this year we held development forums for each Local Government Area where all relevant football stakeholders (EDFL staff, EDFL clubs, Essendon FC, AFL Victoria & Council) were invited to provide their thoughts on what support is required for EDFL clubs. The feedback obtained from these forums will be used to help shape a Club Information Day planned for 2018.

### **Club Improvement Program**

We have continued to encourage clubs to complete the Club Improvement Program, but the uptake remains low within our region. This program is a fantastic tool designed to assist in all facets of your club and we implore committees to go through the process in 2018.

### Coaching

Ultimately, we can do as much work as possible to attract participants to footy clubs, but if the environment is not conducive to retaining them, they will be lost to the game. Hence the work we continue to do around increasing the quality of coaching remains integral to the growth of the game. Coaches play the most critical role in the experience many of us have, and clubs that are proactive in establishing positive environments are having success in the recruitment and retention of players, setting themselves up for sustained success.

To support the development of our community coaches, this year we trialled the 'Better Coach Project'. This was a blended learning approach that involved online learning, face-to-face development sessions and coach mentoring. The vision of this project was to see positive coaching environments, personal growth in junior players along with team development and success. The 12 coaches who undertook this program were instrumental in the change of coaching and noticed significant improvement in their own coaching ability. In 2018, we will be looking to extend the success of this program out to the wider coaching community.

In 2018, we will again continue to encourage all clubs to appoint a Junior Club Coaching Co-Ordinator. The uptake in this position is currently not where we would like it to be, so we continue to encourage all clubs to invest time and effort into this position - whose primary responsibility is to oversee the entire junior coaching group. The Coaching Co-Ordinator establishes the learning and development environment for both the coaches and players, while providing a consistency in coaching throughout the whole club.

### **Auskick**

This year also saw our Auskick numbers continue to increase throughout the region,

with a number of new centres opening up. In partnership with MAB, a new centre was established at the Merrifield Estate on Donnybrook Road, while our over-arching diversity strategy saw a new centre opened at the MY Centre Facility in Broadmeadows, catering to participants with a Muslim background. We will continue to work hard to identify opportunities for new centres to ensure everyone within our community has a chance to engage in our game.

### **Female Football**

This time last year we were still finalising what the AFLW Competition would look like and no one could have predicted the amount of success it would enjoy in such a short period of time. This initial success has continued the amazing momentum that female football has sustained over a significant period of time - this year alone saw 19 new under-age female teams enter standalone competitions. Next year the EDFL competition offering will expand to include U9, U11, U13, U15 and U18 age groups, on top of a standalone Senior Women's Competition. This now completes the full pathway for female footballers in the region and we will continue to endeavour to support clubs as best we can through this period of unprecedented growth. In conjunction with Moonee Valley City Council, we kick started the female football season with an AFL 9s round robin competition for the U12 and U15 age groups. This was a fantastic opportunity for clubs to recruit new players to their clubs and provide players with the chance to experience football in a fun and safe way. With the success of this event, we will look to deliver this event again in 2018.

### **Appreciation**

Congratulations to everyone on the year and thank you for all your support – we hope that it was one filled with great memories and has left you with a strong appetite to remain involved in 2018 and beyond. We hope you enjoy a well-earned break over the summer period.





#### NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

#### Deferred Income

Unspent grant income received in relation to specific projects and events is not brought to account as revenue in the current year but deferred as a liability in the financial statements until spent for the purpose received.

#### Capital Grants

Grant income received relating to the purchase of capital items is shown as Unamortised Capital Grant and brought to account over the expected life of the asset in proportion to the related depreciation charge.

#### Interest Income

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method. Interest earnt from financial institutions is recognised when it is actually received from the financial institutions.

#### (d) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash on hand and in banks and short term deposits are stated at nominal value. For the purposes of the Cash Flow Statement, cash includes cash on hand and in banks and money market instruments, readily convertible to cash within two (2) working days, net of outstanding bank overdrafts.

#### (e) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included as part of receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

#### (f) Employee Entitlements

Provision is made for the League's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be wholly settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

Provision is made for the League's liability for long service leave from the 5 year employment period normally accrued as industry practice.

#### (g) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the League has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

#### NOTE 2: RELATED PARTIES

During the year ended 31 October, 2017, there were no related party transactions entered into by the League with members of the Committee.

It is our understanding that the association intends to electronically present the audited financial report and auditor's report on its internet website. Responsibility for the electronic presentation of the financial report on the association website is that of those charged with governance of the association. The security and controls over information on the website should be addressed by the association to maintain the integrity of the data presented. The examination of the controls over the electronic presentation of the audited financial report on the association website is beyond the scope of the audit of the financial report.

#### Qualification

As is common for organisations of this type, it is not practicable for the Essendon District Football League Inc. to maintain an effective system of internal control over fundraising activities, until their initial entry in the accounting records. Accordingly, our audit in relation to fundraising was limited to amounts recorded. The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

#### Qualified Audit Opinion

In our opinion, subject to the effect of the qualification above, the financial report of the Essendon District Football League Inc. presents fairly, in all material respects the financial position of the Essendon District Football League Inc. as at 31 October, 2017 and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended on that date and complies with Australian Accounting Standards to the extent described in Note1 and the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Vic).

#### Basis of Accounting

Without modifying our opinion, we draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the committee of management of the association reporting responsibilities. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.
